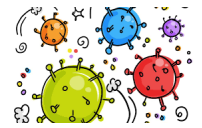

Coronavirus Update

Lampasas County Health Authority Dr. Georgia Hay shared with Lampasas Radio last night that Lampasas County now has 89 total cases, with 27 active and 2 in the hospital.

Texas reported 10,791 new cases on July 15. There are 10,471 Texans are in the hospital for the coronavirus as of July 15. They occupy 18.6% of hospital beds. 3,432 Texans have died as of July 15.

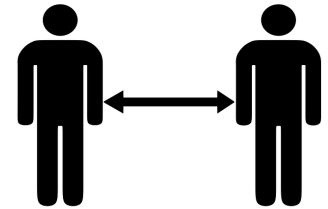

The 2020-2021 School Year



According to the Texas Tribune, the state still doesn't have final rules on how schools should reopen this fall, and the picture grew only slightly less murky Wednesday.

The state made clear that it won't financially penalize districts that don't open for in-person classes within three weeks of starting their school year *if a local public health agency orders classrooms to remain closed.*

Last week, the state's education agency said all schools must offer in-person instruction for all students who want it this fall, allowing districts a transition period of just three weeks at the start of the year to hold classes virtually and get safety plans in place.

This week, officials began slowly pulling back on those stringent requirements. Gov. Greg Abbott said Tuesday that districts can expect more flexibility on opening classrooms. And state education officials told The Texas Tribune on Wednesday that they would continue to fund school districts choosing to stay completely virtual for more than three weeks, if local health officials mandate it.

The conflicting mandates pingponging between state and local officials are frustrating many parents, students and teachers trying to plan for a fall semester during a raging pandemic. In the middle of the confusion, school superintendents are crafting their own plans for reopening this fall, sometimes going against established state guidance.

More and more districts across the state are pushing their start dates back later into August or September and choosing to stay entirely virtual for at least the first few weeks.

And teachers, among the loudest critics of reopening, have argued the state's decision to mandate in-person classes puts their health on the line. State guidance allows parents to opt out of in-person learning but says little about how school districts should protect teachers and staff. Local teachers associations are encouraging their members to look for legal avenues to stay home, including resigning or retiring early, instead of being forced back into classrooms while cases are rising.

A TEA spokesperson told the Tribune that school superintendents and school boards cannot make the decision to stay entirely virtual for longer than three *weeks without a mandate from public health officials.*"

It will be an interesting next few weeks.
