From Texas DPS: "Texas DPS Troopers responded to a report of a triple fatality crash involving a wrong way driver at 1:56am on July 16th. A 2017 Toyota Corolla, operated by 22-year-old Matthew Fernandez, of Ft. Hood, Texas, was travelling eastbound in the westbound lane of travel on IH-14 near the Ft. Hood T.J. Mills exit. A 2013 Kia Optima, operated by a 20-year-old female from Copperas Cove, Texas, was travelling westbound on IH-14 approaching the wrong way driver. The vehicles collided head on causing substantial damage. The Toyota caught fire after the collision. Good Samaritans attempted to free the driver from the burning vehicle to no avail. Two rear seat passengers in the Kia identified as 22-year-old Joshua Smith of Copperas Cove Texas,

and 20-year-old Aaliyah Marie Peinado, of Nipomo, California were unrestrained and died in the collision as a result of their injuries. They both were pronounced deceased by Justice of the Peace Gregory Johnson. The 20-year-old female passenger of the Kia was transported to Baylor Scott and White in Temple with incapacitating injuries. Fernandez was pronounced deceased by Justice of the Peace Gregory Johnson. The crash investigation is still active and open. Next of kin of everyone involved have been notified

Uvalde School Shooting

The loved ones of 21 people killed during Texas' worst school shooting have spent weeks grieving their losses and begging officials for answers.

But even after state officials publicly released the most comprehensive look yet at the Robb Elementary shooting and law enforcement's painful delay in confronting the gunman, many relatives of the victims expressed anger and continued frustration Sunday.

Hours earlier, the committee had released a report describing how the shooter prepared and armed himself, how the school district fell short on campus safety preparations and how law enforcement moved too slowly to kill the shooter.

Once law enforcement made it to the school, it took more than an hour to confront the gunman, something that has been heavily criticized by residents, officials and experts. It is unclear whether a flawless police response would have saved any lives. But the report suggests that stopping the gunman sooner could have made a difference for some victims.

For weeks, state leaders have largely blamed Uvalde schools police Chief Pete Arredondo for law enforcement waiting more than an hour to confront the gunman. But the House report said failures went beyond local police. The report said 376 law enforcement officers from several local, state and federal agencies lacked clear leadership, basic communications and sufficient urgency to take down the gunman.



(cont'd from front) Since the Uvalde massacre, state leaders have said they want to focus on "hardening" schools and increasing mental health care access.

The Uvalde schools police chief and the acting chief of the city police department on the day of the shooting have both been placed on leave as their actions are investigated.

While House committee members didn't publicly address the legal or professional fates of law enforcement, Guzman, the former Texas Supreme Court justice, said officers who failed to take action should not be working in law enforcement.

."The report says that if you're not willing to put the lives of the people you serve or of those children before your own, in my view you should find another job," she said.

Pedestrian Safety

As Texans enjoy summer activities outdoors, TxDOT's Be Safe. Drive Smart. campaign urges drivers and pedestrians to watch out for each other as pedestrian deaths continue to rise.

In 2021, 5,366 traffic crashes involving pedestrians occurred in Texas, and as a result 841 people were killed, a 15% increase in pedestrian fatalities over the previous year. Another 1,470 people

were seriously injured.

"Only 1% of traffic crashes in Texas involve pedestrians, yet pedestrians account for 19% of all roadway deaths," said TxDOT Executive Director Marc Williams. "To keep our most vulnerable road users safe, we urge motorists to always be on the lookout for people walking. Pedestrians also have the responsibility to be aware of their surroundings and follow the rules of the road."

Crash reports from law enforcement indicate the leading factors of pedestrian-related traffic crashes include 1) pedestrians failing to yield the right of way to vehicles, 2) driver inattention, 3) motorists failing to yield the right of way to pedestrians,

4) failure to control speed, and 5) drivers and/or pedestrians being under the influence of alcohol.

TxDOT offers these safety reminders to prevent a deadly encounter:

For drivers:

- · Stop for pedestrians in crosswalks.
- · When turning, yield the right of way to pedestrians.
- · Be cautious when passing stopped buses or other vehicles.
- · Pay attention and put your phone away, so you're always prepared if pedestrians enter your path.
- · Follow the posted speed limit and drive to conditions. For people walking:
- \cdot Cross the street only at intersections and crosswalks. Look left, right, then left again before crossing.
- \cdot Make eye contact with drivers before crossing. Don't assume drivers see you.
- · Follow all traffic and crosswalk signals.
- · Use the sidewalk. If there isn't one, walk on the left side of the road, facing oncoming traffic.
- · When walking, put away electronic devices that take your eyes and ears off the road.
- · Wear reflective materials or use a flashlight at night.
