The Weather

The high yesterday 103° This morning's low 76° Lampasas County is under an Excessive Heat Warning until tonight at 9pm.

Today: Sunny and hot with a high temperature near 104°. Winds will be S-SW near 5-10 mph.

Tonight: Look for partly cloudy skies and the low temperature will dip to near 76° with S-SE winds near 10 mph.

Thursday: Sunny and hot with a high temperature near 100°. Einds will be SE at 5-10 mph.

Thursday Night: Partly cloudy skies with a low near 75°. Winds will be S-SE at 5-10 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Friday: Skies will be mostly sunny with the temperature topping out near 100°. Wind will be S-SE near 5-10 mph with possible gusts of 20 mph.

Friday Night: Partly cloudy skies and the low will be near 75°. Winds will be S-SE near 5-10 mph with possible gusts of 20 mph.

From the Texas A & M **Forestry Service**

The fire environment, characterized by critically to extremely dry vegetation and critical fire weather, will support wildfire activity this week.

Areas of concern include the eastern Rolling Plains, Cross Timbers, Central Texas, North Texas near the

Waco and Dallas-Fort Worth areas and south along the I-35 corridor near the Capital region. The risk for significant fires is also expanding east to include portions of East Texas, including areas near Palestine, Crockett, Huntsville, Tyler and Marshall.



Ninety-nine percent of the state is experiencing some level of drought. The rainfall received last week was minimal and offered only a temporary reprieve from the dry conditions in some areas.

On Monday, elevated to critical fire weather and critically dry vegetation contributed to extreme fire behavior in parts of North Central Texas and East Texas. Active crown fire and short-range spotting of embers and flammable material one quarter mile in front of the main wildfire were reported.

"The wildfires in Palo Pinto, Somervell and Walker counties occurred in high-risk fuel types, which can exhibit extreme fire behavior when critically dry and exposed to elevated or critical fire weather," said Luke Kanclerz, Texas A&M Forest Service Fire Analyst. "In these fuels, resistance to control is often high and makes suppression efforts challenging for firefighters."

State and local firefighters, including Texas A&M Forest Service and Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS) personnel, responded to 18 wildfires Monday for an estimated 6,594 acres burned. This includes the still-burning 1148 Fire in Palo Pinto County, the Chalk Mountain Fire in Somervell County and the Nelson Creek Fire in Walker County.

"The conditions observed yesterday contributed to extremely active wildfires across the state," said Wes Moorehead, Texas A&M Forest Service Fire Chief. "The increased operational tempo will continue over the next week. Texas A&M Forest Service has strategically positioned incident commanders, fire personnel, equipment and aircraft across areas of concern for a quick response."

Aviation resources were available to assist throughout the day and additional aircraft were ordered to respond, including a DC-10, one of the largest aircraft in the national airtanker fleet. Suppression aircraft dropped 141,000 gallons of water and retardant throughout the afternoon, effectively helping to slow the spread of the wildfires. A total of 38 aircraft are currently staged in state for wildfire response.

Stay wildfire aware. If a wildfire is spotted, immediately contact local authorities. A quick response can help save lives and property.



Septic System Maintenance Clinic

A Free Virtual clinic will be held online August 4th presented by Texas A & M Agrilife Extension Service.

The online septic system event is free and will cover what homeowners should know about maintenance, health and safety. There is no software download required to join. To register go to tx.ag/SSMClinicReg (http://tx.ag/SSMClinicReg).

According to Ryan Gerlich, Agrilife extension on-site sewage facilities program specialist "Systems that are not functioning properly can contaminate our waterways with bacteria and other pollutants."

The clinic will provide a basic understanding of the operational and maintenance activities of a septic system and explain how activities within the home impact septic systems.

There will be a short presentation over health and safety considerations, how to care for and 'feed' the system as well as general maintenance procedures. Participants will have the opportunity to ask questions in an informal and interactive manner.

Lisa Prcin, Lampasas River Watershed Coordinator said the clinic will also discuss implementation of the OSSF components of the Lampasas River Watershed Protection Plan. "We have secured federal grant funds available to offset the costs of repairing or replacing failing septic systems within the watershed" Prcin shared that 20 failing septic systems have been replaced in the watershed this year and that although funds are depleted in the current project, a new project is expected later this year.

Funding and support for the Lampasas Watershed Protection Plan is provided through Clean Water Act nonpoint source grants from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.
