Lampasas ISD **School Lunches**

During the COVID-19 pandemic, Congress authorized spending that allowed schools to serve free meals for all students. These funds are not available for the 2022-2023 school year. As a result, Lampasas ISD must return to charging for school meals and offering free and reduced priced meals based on student eligibility. Lampasas ISD is encouraging families to complete the applications for free and reduced price school meals for the upcoming school year. The applications are available at each campus. The completed meal application form can be returned to your child's campus cafeteria or the Nutrition Services office. Online applications will be available in the Lampasas ISD Skyward family access as well. The application will determine a child's eligibility for free and reduced price meals and may assist in the determination for other state or federal benefits. Only one application needs to be

completed per household. Schools will notify the household of the

school nutrition programs in Texas. Decisions regarding payment

child's eligibility. The Texas Dept. of Agriculture administers

for school meals are made at the national-government level, not by Lampasas ISD or the Texas Dept. of Agriculture. The dedicated staff at Lampasas ISD is looking forward to serving healthy, balanced meals to students in the new school year. These meals, whether paid, free or reduced price offer a good source of nutrition for children. Elementary breakfast will be \$2.45 and elementary lunch is \$3.20. Middle and high school breakfast is \$2.45 and middle and high school lunch is \$3.45. Reduced price for breakfast is \$.30 and for lunch it is \$.40.

Under the provisions of the free and reduced-price meal policy, Lampasas ISD Nutrition services will review applications and determine eligibility. Households or guardians dissatisfied with the reviewing official's eligibility determination may wish to discuss the decision with the Reviewing Official on an informal basis. 

(cont'd from front) and the fire is 10% contained. Wildfire today reports that 16 homes have been destroyed, and 5 have been damaged.

Areas north of Highway 67 and west of Highway 56 have been advised to evacuate. The Somerville County Expo Center has food and sleeping arrangements for those evacuated and room for animals as well.

A Temporary Flight Restriction (TFR) is in place over the fire area. Unauthorized aircraft, including drones, near wildfires could cause injury or death to firefighters and results in a suspension of all aerial firefighting until unauthorized aircraft leave the area. This hampers crews fire suppression abilities and can result in uncontrolled fire growth.

Yesterday firefighters responded to 10 new fires that burned 408 acres.

Texas Men Indicted for the Deaths of 53 people

Two Texas men were indicted Wednesday on federal charges for their roles in the deaths of 53 people in what officials have called the deadliest migrant smuggling case in U.S. history.

The migrants — from Mexico and Central America — were found in a sweltering tractor-trailer in Southwest San Antonio last month. Their deaths drew international outrage.

Homero Zamorano Jr. of Pasadena and Christian Martinez of Palestine face charges of transporting undocumented migrants in a way that resulted in serious injury, death and the jeopardizing of lives. If tried and convicted, the men could face life in prison or the death penalty. The United States Attorney's Office for the Western District of Texas announced the indictments Wednesday.

Zamorano, 45, was the driver of the tractor-trailer. He abandoned it on a semirural road near Interstate 35 and tried to flee, officials previously said.

"A search warrant was executed on a cell phone belonging to Zamorano. Through investigation, it was discovered that communications occurred between Zamorano and Martinez concerning the smuggling event," said a Wednesday statement from the U.S. Attorney's Office.

Federal officials said that 48 migrants died at the scene — including 22 people from Mexico, seven from Guatemala and two from Honduras. Sixteen other undocumented migrants were taken to hospitals, where five of them died.

The gruesome crime and its sheer scale — 64 migrants huddled in a big rig without water or air conditioning, in heat that reached 100 degrees that day — has staggered even veteran law enforcement officials who work along the U.S.-Mexico border.
