The Weather

Commissioners Meet

Lampasas County Commissioners met Monday at 9am for a regular meeting.

The commissioners reviewed the 2018 audit report, and it was decided that everything was correct and that it was a clean report.

Regarding the PID request that was sent to the county, Bart Fowler of McCall, Parkhurst & Horton presented information about Public Improvement Districts. In his information he stated that the service and assessment plan covers a minimum of 5 years and can be revised annually by the commissioners court. Commissioner Smart raised the question about how creating another taxing entity would benefit our county. Mr. Fowler stated that there would be multiple benefits, one of which would be population growth for our county. There will be more discussion about the PID in future meetings.

The resignation of Shane Brown was acknowledged. It is unknown at this time who will take the position for the remainder of his contract, however two applications have been received for the position.

The 2020 Appraisal and Collections budget was approved for \$27,000, which is a 3% increase over last year's budget. The ESD fire protection district petition was denied. With the supporters of the ESD unable to receive consent from the Copperas Cove City Council, the petition was unable to move forward. Joining in this conversation was Mr. Brook who suggested that the local fire/EMS review or revamp the mutual aid agreements. Mutual Aid is an agreement among emergency responders to provide assistance across service boundaries due to an emergency response that exceeds the local resources.



Lampasas City Council Meeting

Yesterday the regular meeting of the City Council was held at the City Council Chambers. The meeting began with the boards/ department reports

The Parks and Recreation monthly report went over the developments and improvements; starting with the park improvements. The city has demolished the old restrooms at Brook Park and installed new ones. A new pavilion was put in place, and there will be irrigation and sod installed in the park later this year. Replacement of the fall zone material on the playground was also done with assistance from LCRA as well as cleaning, painting, and refurbishing signage at each park.

There was a discussion of the continued implementation of aquatic vegetation management in Sulphur Creek/ The City Council asked to have members of the Texas Wildlife and Parks come to the next meeting to discuss possible action to control the amount of vegetation in the creek.

The Parks and Recreation also talked about the multiple improvements to the Oak Hill Cemetery, which included the restoration of more than 100 unmarked graves. An Eagle Scout project was praised because of the beautiful fencing that was put up behind the Veterans Memorial.

Next on the agenda was the City Manager's Operational Reports, which included: the PID, Public Improvement District, where the city staff was invited to meet with county representatives regarding the inquiry from a developer regarding infrastructure funding.

Business related to Public Art at City Hall was discussed and approved to purchase the "Monarch on a Grass" sculpture for the amount of \$4,000.

The next discussion was the Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) Community Development Partnership Grant Funding for the estimates to repair and paint the exterior of the Lampasas Police Department.

The Lampasas county Chamber of Commerce Budget for FY 2019/2020 was approved. The action to suspend the effective date proposed by ATMOS Energy Corporation was approved to be pushed back 45 days.

The last thing the Council discussed was the request to waive sewer requirement for a property located at 1614 W avenue C, which was accepted as well.

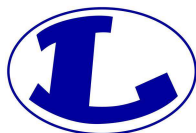

The Blotter



Lampasas Police Dept. Blotter for Monday shows a suspicious person in the 1000 block of W. 1st St at 1:23am. Late in the morning there was a disturbance in the 300 block of E. 3rd St. at 9:17am. The afternoon shows a reckless driver in the 900 block of N. Key at 1:52pm, then a fraud in the 200 block of E. Vine at 3:30pm. A criminal trespass was reported in the 600 block of N. Key at 4:23pm, and a theft in the 110 block of E. 4th St. at 4:52pm. There was criminal mischief in the 1900 block of Yellowstone Dr. at 8:14pm, then suspicious activity in the 1500 block of E. 3rd St. at 8:32. An assault by threat was called in from the 300 block of 1st St. at 11:30pm.

Lampasas Sheriff's Dept. Blotter for Monday shows Lometa responding to a civil matter, Kempner responded to a medical call, a reported burglary, civil matters and an alarm call. Out in the county there were civil matters, medical calls, a welfare check and a reported harassment. Deputies went into Cove for a call about a reckless driver.

The Jail Log shows the arrest of a 62 year old Kempner man for resisting arrest and criminal trespass, and a 24 year old Copperas Cove man on a bond surrender. Aleigha Sims, 17, of Lometa was arrested for Aggravated Assault with a Deadly Weapon.

The Burn Ban has been lifted until July 29 at 7pm.

District Court Notes

Lampasas Courthouse was the site of a 27th District court Docket Call on July 19th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Judge John Gauntt.



Altogether 48 cases were brought to the court, 38 of them involved men and 10 involved women. There were 19 cases involving possession of a controlled substance PG1; 15 cases for possession under a gram including one in drug free zone, and 4 cases for possession of 1-4 grams. There were 2 cases involving possession of marijuana over 4 oz. less than 5 lbs. Two cases were brought for having a prohibited substance in a correctional facility. There were 3 DWI cases, all having a passenger under 15 years of age in the vehicle.

There was one case for felony burglary and one for theft of \$2,500-\$30,000. There were 2 cases for evading arrest with a vehicle and 2 cases for unauthorized use of a motor vehicle.

There was 1 fraud case, 1 forgery case and 1 for tampering with evidence.

Crimes involving personal harm include one case of injury to a child/elderly, one for continuous violence against family. One aggravated assault against a household member, one stalking case and one arson case. Sex crimes included 2 cases of a sex offender failing to register, 2 cases of possession of child porn. There was one sexual assault case, and 2 cases of sexual assault of a child. Of the 48 cases presented, 14 were decided, with Bobbie Jo Stribling of Copperas Cove being sentenced to 2 years state jail probated to 5 years on the charge of DWI with a passenger 15 years or younger. . Annajo Olsen of Purcell Oklahoma was sentenced to 5 years probation plus costs and fees with treatment as a condition of probation on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 more than 1 gram less than 4 grams. Jesse Knight of Hockley, Texas was sentenced to 3 years deferred adjudicated probation plus costs for fraud/use of identifying info less than 5 items. Koal Rainwater saw the charge of DWI with a child under 15 in the vehicle dismissed and will be sentenced on

the charge of tampering with evidence at a later date. Jennifer Murrill of Granite Shoals was punished with 4 years probation plus a \$1000 fine and costs for possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram. Aaron Schoch of Oklahoma was given 4 years of probation , a \$750 fine plus costs on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 more than 1 gram but less than 4 grams. Marcus Lopez of Lampasas was sentenced to 5 years probation, and a \$500 fine, plus costs for failing to register as a sex offender, Lopez saw 2 counts of possession of child pornography dismissed. Reagan Groves had his charge of a prohibited weapon dismissed. Leslie Wallace was sentenced to 3 years of TDCJ with credit for time served plus costs for possession of a controlled substance PG1 more than one less than 4 grams.
