In regards to the missing Roberston children the following has been approved for release:

The ongoing situation has been compounded by Ms. Whitehead's refusal to comply with the courts of the State of Texas. Ms. Whitehead had made numerous allegations of wrongdoing in the past several months all of which were thoroughly investigated by agencies outside our area. In each case the allegations brought forth by Ms. Whitehead were found to be without merit and false. Ms. Whitehead has been ordered by the District Court of Lampasas/Bell Counties to surrender the children to their biological father and has refused to do so in each instance citing the false allegations as her reasoning. On 6/3/2022 Ms. Whitehead was ordered by the court verbally and in writing of the consequences of her continued belligerence and the consequence which can and will follow. The case was referred to the Lampasas County Sheriff's Office, and subsequent warrants for Kidnapping were issued for Ms. Whitehead. Ms. Whitehead has continued to dodge, secret, hide and keep the children from their parent. On 7/22/2022 Information was presented to the 27th District Court in Lampasas, TX that leads the court to believe the children (Christopher Robertson, Christine Robertson, and Kristen Robertson) were in mental and or physical danger. This prompted the court to issue an order terminating Ms. Whitehead's custodial rights and ordered the children brought before said court for their safety and well being. This order prompted the alert which has been issued in and around the State of Texas. The Lampasas County Sheriff's Office has enlisted the help of the US Marshals Office and the FBI in the locating and recovering of the children for a safe return. The Lampasas County Sheriff's Office is asking for anyone who has seen, knows the whereabouts, or can provide

current and solid information to contact them at (512) 556-8255 or your local law enforcement to help in the safe recovery of the children.



Beware Employment Scams

Better Business Bureau is warning Texas residents of increased reports regarding employment scams impacting communities across the Lone Star State. BBB Scam Tracker reports nearly tripled between March to June 2022 and historical data indicates the season for employment scams is not over yet.

"For the past two years, employment scam reports significantly increased during the summer months both in Texas and across the U.S.," said Heather Massey, vice president of communications for Better Business Bureau serving the Heart of Texas. "Texas residents have reported nearly \$50,000 in losses so far this year, and in 2021, 34 percent of all employment scam reports were submitted between April to August. BBB received nearly three times the number of employment scam reports in June from March this year."

Unfortunately, victims of employment scams may also be inadvertently participating in illegal activity, particularly for positions involving package reshipment. According to the FBI, reshipping scams can involve fraudsters who use stolen credit cards to buy expensive items and, instead of having the item shipped directly to their address, use a "re-shipper" to send the package overseas. Package reshipment positions may also be handling stolen goods or laundered money.

*Be wary of package reshipment, secret shopper positions, and any jobs with generic titles such as caregiver, administrative assistant, or customer service representative.

*Beware aggressive employment offers. Any pressure to sign or onboard immediately indicates that the company may not be legitimate.

*Do not deposit unexpected or suspicious checks.

*Get contracts in writing.

If you have been a victim of an employment scam, report it to BBB Scam Tracker. Information provided may prevent another person from falling victim.
