Lampasas ISD School Board to Meet

The Lampasas ISD School Board will meet for a regular School Board Meeting and a Called Meeting on Monday August 1st.

The regular meeting will begin at 6pm at the Administration Building. The Agenda includes: the Oath of Office and reorganization of the Board with the president, vice president and secretary being elected. The consent agenda includes a budget amendment, the Skyward annual licensing fee, consultant services for IT network issues, some business with policy updates and purchasing fiber optic cable including installation from Hanna Springs Elementary to Transportation/Maintenance. The agenda also includes discussion of breakfast and lunch prices, a date for a public hearing on the budget and proposed tax rate for 2022-2023, administrative reports, school safety and security, and the Kline Whitis long term facility plan.

The called meeting for the Lampasas ISD School Board will take place at 7pm or immediately following the regular meeting and the agenda includes the 2022-2023 budget workshop.

The Chalk Mountain Fire

(The Texas A & M Forest Service) In what some would call an uncanny coincidence, the shape of the Chalk Mountain Fire closely resembles the dinosaur tracks in the nearby Dinosaur Valley State Park. Several residents of Glen Rose and surrounding communities have pointed out to fire personnel the similarity between the fire perimeter and the three-toed (theropod) tracks that Acrocanthosaurus dinosaurs left in the mud 113 million years ago.

The state park, which was established in 1972 to preserve and showcase the tracks in the limestone river bottom, is less than half a mile to the east of the Chalk Mountain Fire. The fire, which started on July 18, was pushed by high winds toward the north and northeast. During that first evening, the fire threatened the state park itself.

A wildfire's shape usually is determined by wind direction, terrain, and the types of vegetative fuels available to the fire. The Chalk Mountain Fire spread from its origin in roughly a northerly direction, with three wind-driven runs in separate directions.

Firefighters generally refer to the starting point of a fire as its heel, and the front of the fire as its head. (*cont'd on back*)

(cont'd from front) If the head runs in multiple directions, each run is referred to as a finger. Because of the dinosaur footprints for which the area is known, fire managers have referred to the three fingers on this fire as the right, middle and left toes.

Besides the disastrous impact of the fire to homeowners and ranchers, residents are likely to remember the Chalk Mountain Fire for several years to come as the fire that looked like a dinosaur track.



The Ike Dike

The U.S. Senate on Thursday approved a bill that would authorize federal agencies to plan for an estimated \$31 billion project intended to protect the Texas coast from hurricanes.

Hundreds of millions of dollars have already gone into studying the idea to build a system of concrete gate barriers at the mouth of Galveston Bay. Nicknamed for the destructive hurricane that hit Galveston Island in 2008, the so-called Ike Dike could be the largest civil engineering project in U.S. history.

The project is included the Water Resources Development Act, which contains various federal water, coast and flooding projects that require congressional approval to move forward, but does not allocate funds. The bill passed with 93 yes votes in the Senate on Thursday; only Sen. Mike Braun, R-Indiana, voted no.

The Ike Dike gate project alone would account for at least \$16 billion and require 18 years to build, according to U.S. Army Corps of Engineers estimates. The gates would span a nearly 2-mile gap from the island to Bolivar Peninsula.

The act doesn't include funding for the Ike Dike and the rest of the Texas coast projects, which will require a separate request to Congress from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Congress is expected to fund the project in smaller appropriations rather than all at once

Domestic Semiconductor Production

The U.S. House on Thursday passed a bill backed by leading Republicans in Texas to encourage domestic semiconductor production, even as most Texas Republicans in the chamber voted against the measure.

U.S. Reps. Michael McCaul of Austin and Kay Granger of Fort Worth were the only Texas Republicans to vote for the bill, along with all the chamber's Texas Democrats. The bill passed the House by a vote of 243-187-1 after winning U.S. Senate approval earlier this week. It now awaits final approval from President Joe Biden, who supports the bill.

The legislation incentivizes companies that produce semiconductors — chips that power anything from a car to a cellphone — to work in the United States, as concerns mount over China and other countries' growing influence over the industry. The U.S., once considered a leader in global semiconductor production, has seen its share of chip production wane over the past few decades.

The bill provides \$52 billion in subsidies for domestic semiconductor manufacturers and provides a tax credit for investments in semiconductor manufacturing.

The bill had the support of leading Texas Republicans, including Gov. Greg Abbott and House Speaker Dade Phelan, who lauded the bill as an opportunity for job creation in the state. It's a rare point of agreement between Republicans in Texas and the Biden administration, which has been pushing for months to combat foreign domination of chip production.

U.S. Sen. John Cornyn, R-Texas, helped lead the effort to pass the semiconductors legislation. Ted Cruz, Texas' junior Republican senator, voted against the bill because of the money distributed to massive corporations.

Governor Abbott released this statement "Texas is a beacon of innovation and has remained the nation's leading exporter of semiconductors and other electronic components for eleven years in a row. The passage of the CHIPS Act of 2022 will leverage Texas' investments in the semiconductor industry and encourage more semiconductor-related companies to operate in the Lone Star State. In addition to enabling Texas and the United States to create even greater economic potential, this Act will further cement a secure semiconductor supply chain in our country and strengthen national security by decreasing our dependence on foreign production. I want to thank both Senator Cornyn and Representative McCaul for their leadership in passing this critical legislation, charting a course for greater opportunities for generations of Texans and Americans."
