The Weather

The High yesterday 97° The Low this morning 77°

Today: There are clouds overhead and a 40% chance of some rain between 11am and 5pm. The high should get up to about 94° unless the clouds do a lot for us. The north breeze is about 5 to 10 mph today.

Tonight: There's a 20% chance of rain early evening, then an overnight low of 72° with north wind 5-10 mph.

Saturday: Sunny and up to 96° on day 1 of the weekend, with calm winds out of the N-NE in the morning.

Rest of the weekend: Saturday night's temp should drop to about 71° with the N-NE wind still light.

Sunday morning we'll wake up with a cool N-NE breeze and that will turn to a warm 95° in the afternoon.

Next week: Look for east breeze on Monday and a high up to 96°.wind a west wind that will shift to northerly in the afternoon. Sunday's high will get up to about 65°. There's a small rain chance Monday night and Tuesday and look for about 95° highs thru Wednesday.

If you are planning to be on the road, note this cooperative public service notice from TxDOT:

At any given time, the Texas Department of Transportation has as many as 3,000 active work zones on the 80,000 miles of roadway it maintains across the state. I-35 is a major transportation artery and one of the largest active work zones in Texas. In 2019, a total of 20,488 traffic crashes occurred along the I-35 corridor, resulting in 141 deaths and 523 serious injuries. As the summer travel season continues, TxDOT encourages all motorists to make sure they take precautions when driving on I-35, especially through construction and maintenance areas. TxDOT offers the following tips to help motorists stay safe this summer when traveling the state's highways.

Be safe as you navigate through a work zone.

- Slow down and always follow the posted speed limit.
 Remember, traffic fines double in work zones when workers are present.
- Pay attention. Avoid distractions, keep your mind on the road and put your phone away.
- Watch out for road crews. Their only protection gear is a vest, hardhat and safety boots. Their bodies are no match for your vehicle.

- **Don't tailgate**. Give yourself room to stop in a hurry if you have to. Rear-end collisions are the most common type of work zone crash.
- Allow extra time. Road construction slows things down.
 Count on it, and plan for it.
- Check DriveTexas.org before hitting the road. The
 website contains information about highway and road
 conditions throughout the state.

"Move over or slow down." It's the law.

When approaching a stopped emergency vehicle, TxDOT vehicle, tow truck or utility vehicle with flashing lights, drivers must move over a lane or reduce their speed to 20 mph below the posted speed limit.


Violations can result in a fine of up to \$2,000.


