## The Weather



**The High yesterday 98° The Low this morning 70°**

The forecasters say we have a slight chance of a shower this afternoon. Otherwise hot and sunny with very humid conditions by the end of the week. Heat indices will be nearing 100°.

**Today:** Look for mostly cloudy skies and a high near 96°. There is a 40% chance of showers and storms this afternoon. Winds will be light from the west.

**Tonight:** Skies will be partly cloudy with a low temperature near 71°. Winds will continue to be light from the S-SE.

**Tuesday:** Sunny skies and a high near 99°. Winds will be light becoming S-SE.

## Meetings Today

**The Lampasas School Board will meet at 6pm today** in the Administration Building for a regularly called meeting.

On the main agenda are miscellaneous items on a one-vote approval consent agenda, then a Central Appraisal District budget amendment to approve and a matter of retaining consultant services for IT network issues, some bills to approve, the LCAD budget, setting the date for a public hearing on the new year's budget and tax rate, commitment of a fund balance, possible discussion on the Petition for Detachment/Annexation, administrative reports and real property matters.

**Today at 5:30pm the Lampasas City Council will meet in a Special Session** to discuss the City's fiscal year 20/21 Budget. There will be departmental budget presentations and a possible action on modifications to the preliminary budget.

## Other City News

**The City of Lampasas** will hold a public hearing for the fiscal year 2020/2021 budget on Monday August 10<sup>th</sup>. The hearing will cover the City Manger's proposed budget and will be part of the regularly scheduled City Council meeting on that day.

**The City of Lampasas** is looking for volunteers to serve on various boards and commissions. Several boards have members that are reaching the expiration of their terms.

The boards include the Airport Advisory Board, Capital Improvement Program Committee, Golf Course Advisory Board, Economic Development Corporation Board, Construction Board of Adjustments and Appeals, Joint Airport Board of Adjustment, Library Advisory Board, Parks & Recreation Advisory Board, Planning and Zoning Commission, and the Zoning Board of Adjustment.

## Statement on Texas Schools

Governor Greg Abbott, Lieutenant Governor Dan Patrick, Speaker Dennis Bonnen, Senate Education Chairman Larry Taylor, and House Education Chairman Dan Huberty released the following statement on school re-openings this fall:

"The Texas Education Agency's (TEA) guidance for opening public schools in Texas for the 2020-21 school year remains the same as announced two weeks ago. This guidance followed a letter issued jointly by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Speaker, and Chairs of the Senate and House Education Committees.

"The top priority is protecting the safety and health of students, teachers, staff, and families. To achieve that goal, the TEA provided local school boards the flexibility they need to open schools in ways that ensure public safety while also providing the best education options for students during this challenging school year.

"The TEA guidance applies long-standing state law and Executive Orders to conclude that the authority to make decisions about when and how schools safely open rests with the constitutionally and statutorily established local school boards.

"The authority to decide when the school year will begin lies with local school boards. They can choose dates in August, September, or even later. But, whenever the local school board chooses to open, the board must comply with the requirement to provide the necessary number of days and hours of instruction for students.

"The authority to decide how schools will safely open this year, again, lies with local school boards. It can be with students in schools, it can be through remote learning, or a combination of the two. In making that decision, school boards have the ability to base their decisions on advice and recommendations by local public health authorities but are not bound by those recommendations.

"As the TEA previously announced, school boards have up to a 4-week back to school transition period during which they can offer a solely remote instructional setting if that is deemed needed for the health and safety of students, teachers, staff and parents. After 4 weeks, the school district can extend the transition period up to another 4 weeks with a vote of the school board and receiving a waiver. If any school district believes they need an extension beyond 8 weeks due to COVID-19 related issues, the TEA will review that request on a case-by-case basis.

"If at any time during the school year a COVID-19 case is confirmed on a school campus, the school board has the ability to close the campus for up to 5 days to sanitize the campus. Schools that close under this scenario will continue to be funded for providing remote-only instruction. *(cont'd on back)*

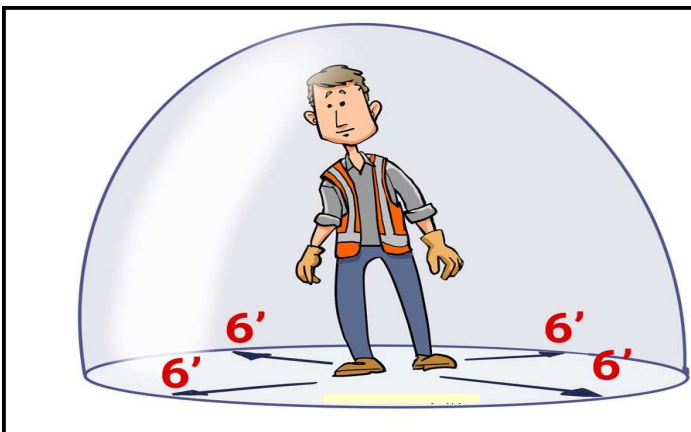

"Additionally, during the course of the school year, a local public health authority may determine that a school building must be closed in response to an outbreak. If that occurs, that school will continue to receive funding for providing remote-only instruction during the period of that closure. "The TEA and the Attorney General correctly note that local health authorities play an important role in school closure determinations during the course of a school year if it is determined that a contamination has occurred necessitating closure, but local health authorities do not have the power to issue preemptive, blanket closures of schools weeks or months in advance of when a school may open its doors to students. Pre-existing Executive Orders have repeatedly made clear that local government operations, such as public schools, are permitted to be open.

It is clear that school boards can and should work collaboratively with, but not be subject to the advance directives of, local public health authorities, to ensure a safe and effective learning environment for Texas students
