The Weather

The High yesterday 96° The Low this morning 70°

The forecasters say that we may see a few afternoon showers; otherwise the story is the heat. Look for the thermometer to read 2°-5° above normal, however the southerly winds should take the edge off the heat.

Today: Mostly sunny with a high temperature near 97°, and a slight chance of showers in the afternoon. The heat index could reach triple digits. Winds will be light from the S-SE.

Tonight: Mostly clear with a low near 74°. Wind will be S-SE at 5 mph.

Wednesday: Skies will be sunny with a high near 100°. The wind will be S at 5-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Wednesday Night: Mostly clear with a low near 75°. Winds will be S at 5-10 mph.

Thursday: Sunny with a high near 101° and a S-SW wind at 5-15 mph with gusts up to 20 mph.

Thursday Night: Mostly clear with a low near 75°. Winds will be from the S-SE at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Wildfire in San Saba County

Texas A&M Forest Service is in unified command with local resources to manage the Mays Fire in San Saba County, which started on August 2, 2020. The fire is currently an estimated 9,000 acres and 50% contained.

The wildfire is burning in rocky and rough terrain, with multiple structures threatened. Ground crews are working to construct fireline around the fire, working in coordination with aviation resources.

The fire was very active yesterday evening and throughout the night. Firefighters constructed containment lines



with two D6 bulldozers followed by a Type 6 fire engine for support on the right flank last night. Task forces focused on structure protection for structures on the northeast corner of the heel of the fire before engaging on the right flank of the fire. Bulldozers will continue to construct containment lines around the fire today. Aviation resources on scene include air attack and 2 Type 1 helicopters. Aviation resources will assist ground crews to help slow the spread of the fire by dropping water across the fire area. Fire activity is active this morning and expected to continue as such throughout the day.



Coronavirus Update

Dr. Georgia Hay confirmed that Lampasas County has seen its 4th fatality from COVID-19. The fatality was a woman in a local nursing home. The current count for Lampasas County is 179 total cases with 23 active. One resident remains in the hospital on a ventilator.

8,819 Texans are in the hospital for the coronavirus as of Aug. 3. There were 5,839 new cases reported on Aug. 3rd in the State of Texas.



State Sales Tax Revenue Totaled Nearly \$3 Billion in July

(AUSTIN) — Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar today said state sales tax revenue totaled \$2.98 billion in July, 4.3 percent more than in July 2019.

"State sales tax collections in July were better than expected, increasing despite the high unemployment due to the pandemic," Hegar said. "The increase was due to a surge in collections from the retail trade sector; receipts from other major sectors — including mining, construction, wholesale trade, services and restaurants — showed significant declines.

"Collections from e-commerce were up sharply, as many consumers chose to shop online rather than at brick-and-mortar stores. Increased time spent at home both for teleworking and staycations, in lieu of leisure travel, spurred sharply higher spending for home improvements.

"Collections from sporting goods stores also rose significantly, as consumers turned to home workouts, bicycling, boating, camping and other forms of outdoor recreation consistent with social distancing.

Texas collected the following revenue from other major taxes:

motor vehicle sales and rental taxes — \$466 million, down 3.7 percent from July 2019;

motor fuel taxes — \$304 million, down 2.2 percent from July 2019;

oil production tax — \$187 million, down 40 percent from July 2019;

natural gas production tax — \$37 million, down 71 percent from July 2019;

hotel occupancy tax — \$34 million, down 42 percent from July 2019; and

alcoholic beverage taxes — \$110 million, down 6.2 percent from July 2019.

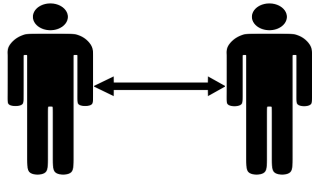

The Blotter

The Sheriff's Dept. Blotter for Monday shows Lometa with a civil matter. Kempner had animal issues, a shots fired call and a medical call. Out in the county there were animal problems, civil matters, accidents, reports of suspicious behavior, and reported disturbances. Deputies went into Cove on a civil matter and a reported theft.

A County-Wide burn ban is in effect for Lampasas County.

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on July 31st. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt.

Altogether 21 cases were brought to the court, 16 of them involved men and 5 involved women.

There were 3 defendants who failed to appear and warrants were issued. Destiny Pierce of San Saba failed to appear on a charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 4-200 grams, Quincell Rahmings of Temple failed to appear on the charges of engaging in organized criminal activity and evading arrest w/vehicle. Andrew Perez of Copperas Cove failed to appear on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram.

There were 6 cases involving possession of a controlled substance PG1, 2 for under 1 gram, 1 case for possession 1-4 grams, 2 cases for possession of 4-200 grams, with one of those for manufacture/delivery. There was one case for possession in a drug free zone. There was one DWI case.

Felony cases for theft or burglary numbered 2.

There was 1 case for evading arrest/detention with a motor vehicle, and one case for unauthorized use of a motor vehicle. There was one case for tampering with a witness/previous convictions, and one case for a prohibited substance in a correctional facility. There was one case each for forgery and engaging in organized criminal activity.

Crimes causing personal harm included 1 for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, and one for abandoning/endangering a child. There was one case for sexual assault, one for aggravated sexual assault of a child, and one for possession of child porn.

Of the 21 cases presented to the court, 4 cases were settled with Brent Gallagher of Harker Heights pleading guilty to possession of a controlled substance PG 1 less than a gram in a drug free zone, and received 10 years probation with SAFPF as a condition. ON the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1-1 to 4 grams, Raymond Reyna plead guilty and received 4 years probation plus costs/fines. Mr. Reyna is required to report to ISF as a condition. Joshua McDaniel plead guilty to possession of child pornography, and received 5 years probation plus court costs. Elvis Smith, of Milano Texas, plead guilty to aggravated sexual assault of a child and received 5 years in TDCJ with credit for days served.

The remainder of the cases were reset or had trials set for a future date.
