## The Weather

## **In Lampasas Radio Studios**

#### This morning Dr. Chane

Rascoe, Superintendent of Lampasas ISD was in Lampasas Radio studios this



morning to visit with Ronnie Witcher.

Dr. Rascoe praised our local School Board and all district employees for their dedication to the students and the community and appreciates their efforts.

He also wanted to recognize the amazing support the Lampasas Community for our district's extra-curricular activities and hopes to see it continue.

Texas House Bill 3 was discussed, and some changes need to be made to our campuses. Protective window film is required on doors and windows that are near the doors and this is a priority for



the district. Also required from House Bill 3 is a 'silent alarm' system that needs to be available to every classroom and/or teacher. The district is at this time receiving quotes on this project. The single-point entry to a school campus has proven to be another challenge for Lampasas ISD, especially in the Middle School, but they are working on a plan, and he said he feels good about the plans the district has in place. Another item with House Bill 3 is that there needs to be an armed person on every campus. While Lampasas ISD has focused efforts on the School Resource Officers (SROs/law enforcement officers), the district is expanding a program to ensure that each campus has at least one trained 'guardian' that will be armed. Dr. Rascoe stated that our local law enforcement agencies have been extremely helpful in accomplishing this and how much the district appreciates all of their help. He also stated that we need to "treat every issue as an immediate threat" and plan and prepare for those situations. Dr. Rascoe feels that Lampasas ISD must have plans in place to protect our kids at all costs.

Regarding transportation, Dr. Rascoe praised the efforts of Beverly Spencer, Lampasas ISD Director of Transportation. He shared that the employees of transportation undergo a lot of training, student safety is the biggest priority, that LISD bus drivers travel a total average of 600 miles per day and that new routes are added as needed all year.

The budgeting process is tricky this year due to the fact that the state legislature is still discussing school funding. The district is also monitoring the growth locally and on the eastern side of the county that will create changes to our school district with possible rezoning in the next few years.

Notes for parents: Attendance will be a focus this school year, so look for a big push in this direction. Also, House Bill 114 made e-cigarettes (or vapes) a DAEP (district alternative education program) mandatory placement. So if a student is caught with a vape at school, they will by law have to be placed in DAEP. Also, Dr. Rascoe urges all parents to talk to their kids about school safety and make sure the channels of communication are open for students to talk to their parents.

### Lady Badger Volleyball



## **Another Red Flag** Warning Today

The National Weather Service has issued a Red Flag Warning for Lampasas county beginning at 1pm today and continuing through 1am tomorrow morning. Lampasas County is expected to experience extreme fire danger this afternoon with temperatures expected to reach 103-108 degrees, south winds gusting to 25 mph, and a relative humidity of 20%. No outdoor burning of any kind is permitted during a red flag warning. Rapid ignition and spread of wildfires is possible due to persistent hot and dry conditions. The Texas A & M Forestry Service responded to 12 requests for assistance yesterday with a total of 3,512 acres burned.
