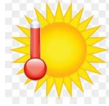

The Weather

Lampasas County is under an Excessive Heat Warning from 12-8pm today

Today: Skies will be sunny with a high temperature near 106°. Winds will be from the S-SW at 10-15 mph.

Tonight: Look for mostly clear skies with a low near 78°. Wind will be from the S near 10-15 gusting to 20 mph.

Sunday: The high temperature will climb to near 106° with sunny skies. Wind will be S-SW near 10 mph.

Sunday Night: Overnight it gets down to 79° with clear skies. Wind will be S near 10-15 mph gusting as high as 20 mph.

Monday: Look for sunny skies with a high temperature near 106°. There will be a S-SW wind near 10 mph.

Monday Night: Mostly clear skies with a low around 78°. Wind will be S-SE near 10-20 mph with possible gusts of 30 mph.

Golf Tournament

Another Red Flag Warning Today

The National Weather Service has issued a Red Flag Warning for Lampasas county beginning at 1pm today and continuing through 1am tomorrow morning. Lampasas County is expected to experience critical fire danger this afternoon with temperatures expected to reach 103-110 degrees, south winds gusting to 20 mph, and a relative humidity of 20%-25%. No outdoor burning of any kind is permitted during a red flag warning. Rapid ignition and spread of wildfires is possible due to persistent hot and dry conditions. The Texas A & M Forestry Service would like to remind everyone to be aware of safety chains dragging on trailers and parking/driving in tall grass, as these things could start fires. Yesterday marked the 36th day of 100° plus days this year, and Stillhouse Hollow Lake is at 605.83 feet elevation this morning. Lampasas has not had measurable rain since July 2nd.

ERCOT Issues Weather Watch

An ERCOT Weather Watch is an advance notification of forecasted significant weather with higher demand and the potential for lower reserves. Grid conditions are expected to be normal, and ERCOT has enough supply to meet demand. There is not a current expectation of an energy emergency. No action is needed. Reducing electric use during peak demand times can help you save and lower demand on the grid.

ERCOT set a new, unofficial August and all-time peak demand record of 83,593 MW on August 1. ERCOT's 6-day Supply and Demand dashboard is showing the possibility of new all-time peak demand records next week. The dashboards will update in real-time as the week progresses. There is currently enough capacity to meet forecasted demand. This summer, ERCOT set 7 new all-time peak demand records. Last year, ERCOT set 11 new peak demand records, surpassing 80 GWs for the first time ever.

ERCOT encourages everyone to sign up for grid condition notifications through the Texas Advisory and Notification System (TXANS). Texans can also monitor real-time and extended grid conditions at ercot.com.

Gas Prices Jump

According to a story from KWTX.com, the gas prices in Texas have jumped once again as more expensive crude oil makes its way onto the market.

The statewide gas price average in Texas is \$3.49 for a gallon of regular unleaded fuel, according to the AAA Texas Weekend Gas Watch. That price is 10 cents more than on this day last week, and is 18 cents less per gallon compared to this day last year.

Of the major metropolitan areas surveyed in Texas, drivers in El Paso are paying the most on average at \$3.78 per gallon while drivers in San Angelo are paying the least at \$3.26 per gallon.

According to AAA, one of the main factors driving up the cost of crude is OPEC production cuts, including another announcement by Saudi Arabia that there will be further cuts to global production output for at least another month. Energy industry analysts also say the extreme heat is impacting refinery production.

Drivers in Texas are paying the seventh-lowest gas price average in the country, according to gasprices.aaa.com. Meanwhile, drivers in California are paying the most at \$5.04 on average for a gallon of regular unleaded

FCC Fines Robocall Company

According to a story from KXXV, The Federal Communications Commission issued a record-breaking fine to the tune of nearly \$300 million against the largest illegal robocall operation it has investigated to date.

The agency issued the fine for auto warranty scam robocalls and spoofing violations, which was announced in a release Thursday.

The illegal operation, which was made up of an international network of companies, violated federal statutes by making robocalls to more than 500 million phone numbers in the span of three months in 2021. They also used more than one million different caller ID numbers, violating federal spoofing laws.

"We take seriously our responsibility to protect consumers and the integrity of U.S. communications networks from the onslaught of these types of pernicious calls," said FCC Enforcement Bureau Chief Loyaan A. Egal.
