The Weather

Today: Partly sunny and hot with a high temperature near 99°. There is a 50% chance of showers and storms in the afternoon. Winds will be SW near 5 mph.

Tonight: Look for mostly cloudy skies and the low temperature will dip to near 75° with a 30% chance of precipitation. Wind will become calm.

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on August 5th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 21 cases were brought to the court with 16 cases involving men, and 5 cases involving women. There were 8 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 4 cases for less than a gram, and 4 cases for 1-4 grams. There was 1 DWI case. Kentae Jackson failed to appear on the charges of bail jumping/failure to appear felony and possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram. Raymond Malone of Dallas, Texas failed to appear on a theft of service \$30,000-\$150,000 charge.

There were 2 cases for theft from person, and one case each for bail jumping/failure to appear, burglary, theft of service, forgery and evading arrest.

In crimes involving personal harm, there were 2 cases of assault on a family member, and one case each of violating a bond or protective order, indecency w/child exposure, and failure to comply with sex offender registration.

Of the 21 cases 8 were resolved with Christon Beamon of Moultrie, GA pleading guilty to two charges of theft from a person. Mr. Beamon was sentenced to 10 years deferred probation plus court costs for both charges and restitution totaling \$108,200. Johnny Wall, of Lampasas pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance PG1 1-4 grams and was sentenced to 10 years probation with the stipulation of attending SAFFP, and court costs. Melinda Sue Downey of Bertram pled guilty to evading arrest w/a vehicle and was sentenced to 5 years probation plus court costs. Natalie Jayroe of Burnet was sentenced to 5 years probation, court costs and a fine, after pleading guilty to possession of a controlled substance PG1 1-4 grams. Guy Smith saw his probation reinstated on the charge of indecency w/a child-exposure. John Maldonado, on the charges of assault of a family member w/prior convictions and failure to register as a sex offender was sentenced to 10 years TDCJ on each charge with 5 years probated on each charge plus court costs.

All other cases were rescheduled or set for jury trials.

There was suspicious activity reported in the 100 block of N. Key Ave. at 11:51pm.

The Lampasas County Sheriff's Blotter for Tuesday shows Lometa with a medical call, livestock issues, an accident and civil matters. In Kempner there were reported disturbances, civil matters, a reported theft, and reports of suspicious activity. Out in the county there was a requested welfare check, civil matters, a mental health call, accidents, a sex offense and a fish & game call.

(cont'd from front) state environmental agency discriminated against racial and ethnic minorities and those with limited English proficiency through a revised permitting process to build new concrete batch plants.

Their complaints, filed with the EPA earlier this year, said TCEQ failed to provide information in Spanish and insufficiently protected communities of color who live in areas where concrete facilities are predominantly located.

The concrete plants are subject to permits that aim to limit pollution in the form of particulate matter and crystalline silica — which have been linked to respiratory diseases and cancer — but independent testing of concrete facilities by the complaint's authors indicate that pollution levels exceed health-based limits.

Last year, TCEQ approved an amendment that included exemptions for emission limitations for concrete batch plants, in response to an application to construct a plant by a Fort Worth concrete company. Area residents had fought the company's application, which was rejected on the grounds that it didn't adequately study the impacts of pollutants. TCEQ later passed the amendment and approved the company's application after what it called a "clerical error."

The EPA's civil rights compliance arm announced the investigation last Wednesday. The investigation will focus on whether the adoption of the amendment — and the permitting process — is discriminatory, and whether the state agency failed to seek meaningful public comment.

Harris County Attorney Christian D. Menefee told The Texas Tribune that the state has consistently made efforts, passed laws and reduced funding to weaken TCEQ, the state's main environmental regulatory agency. Menefee said the agency had a responsibility to seek public comment during the permitting process for batch plants from impacted residents.

"You can't go into a community that has 80% Spanish speakers and folks who are limited in English proficiency and only submit stuff in English," Menefee said. "We're looking for a good-faith execution of the TCEQ's duties and if they're not willing to do that, then we're looking for the EPA to make them do that or to cut their federal funding."

TCEQ declined to comment on the investigation.
