Today is the Day

If you are wanting to get vaccinated, there will be a vaccine clinic today, at Lampasas High School in the cafeteria. This is open to the public, free of charge, no appointment needed. Coronavirus Numbers

Statewide, on August 10th, there were 13,935 new and 3,466 probable cases, along with 10,041 in the hospital. There were 84 deaths from Covid reported as well. Locally, in the last



14 days, Lampasas has seen 154 confirmed cases according to the DSHS website, with 4 being confirmed yesterday. The state estimate of 201 active cases in Lampasas County is holding steady.

School Safety

When Pedestrians are NOT allowed to cross the street or roadway.

Pedestrians are NOT allowed to cross diagonally across an intersection unless specifically authorized to do so by traffic controls or directed by law enforcement. Pedestrians can NOT legally cross the street between two adjacent signalized intersections



(i.e., traffic lights) unless there is a marked mid-block crosswalk. Per Lampasas City Ordinance-Pedestrians are NOT allowed to cross U.S. Highway 281 from Ohnmeiss to the corporate city

limits; other than in a crosswalk due to the dangers that crossing the roadway imposes on Pedestrians, especially if the Pedestrians are children or inebriated individuals.

A substantial number of Pedestrian fatalities occur around Texas each year. The traffic conditions along U.S. 281 are too dangerous for a mid-intersection crosswalk- at this time.


TxDOT will start working on the U.S. 281 improvements in the near future and hopefully will consider the lighting and additional crosswalks during that time. UNTIL THEN DON'T RISK IT! Unless signed otherwise, crosswalks exist across all legs of a four-way intersection. Even when they are not painted. Unpainted crosswalks are referred to as "unmarked" or "implied" crosswalks.

When should drivers yield to Pedestrians?

Drivers must yield to Pedestrians in a crosswalk, even when the driver is permitted to proceed, make a left or a right turn. Drivers must yield to Pedestrians when pulling out or into a driveway or alley.

Drivers are not allowed to pass another vehicle that has stopped for a Pedestrian crossing a street.

Also remember motorists must stop for a school bus with flashing red lights, unless on a divided highway.


