The Weather

Beto O'Rourke Rally

Beto O'Rourke's campaign is planning a rally in Lampasas tomorrow August 18th at the old middle school cafeteria Between North Ave and Avenue B on Western Avenue.

It appears, from surveys, that O'Rourke is just 5 points behind incumbent Governor Greg Abbott in the upcoming Texas Gubernatorial race. And, Beto is pulling out all the stops in his campaign stops across Texas. His campaign announces that they will be on hand around 11:30am at the cafeteria in order to sign up potential supporters or campaign workers.

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on August 12th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 33 cases were

brought to the court with 26 cases involving men, and 7 cases involving women. Keith Clemons of Austin failed to appear on the charge of bail jumping and failure to appear.

There were 11 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 6 cases for less than a gram, 2 cases for 1-4 grams, 2 cases for 4-200 grams and 1 case of manufacture and delivery/possession 1-4 grams.

There were 3 cases each for theft and evading w/a vehicle. There were 2 burglary cases and one case each for unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, engaging in organized criminal activity, forgery, bail jumping/failure to appear and one case for debit/credit card abuse. In crimes involving personal harm, there was one case each of accident involving injury, assault on a family member, aggravated assault of a date and one case of abandoning or endangering a child. There were 2 cases of aggravated sexual assault of a child and two cases of indecency w/a child/sexual contact. There was one case of failure to comply with sex offender registration.

Of the 33 cases 6 were resolved with Joshua Earl pleading guilty to unauthorized use of a vehicle and sentenced to 12 months TDCJ plus court costs with credit for days served. Rogelio Munoz pled guilty to failure to comply with a sex offender's duty to register and was sentenced to 2 years probation. Jessica Finley pled true to engaging in organized criminal activity and is required to have outpatient treatment as a sanction of her probation. Miguel Perez pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram and was sentenced to 5 years probation. John Phillips pled nolo contendere to aggravated assault date/serious bodily injury and was sentenced to 5 years probation plus court costs and fines. David Scott Barczy saw his charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 1-4 grams amended to possession of a controlled substance PG 1 less than a gram and was sentenced to 69 days in the Lampasas County Jail.

All other cases were rescheduled or set for jury trials.

TxDOT Drive Sober

No Regrets

From TxDOT: "Jessica says her mom used to say that the good die young. Tragically, that saying came true while her mom was teaching her how to drive and a drunk driver failed to yield, killing her instantly and sending Jessica to the hospital. Stories like this are part of the Texas Department of Transportation's Drive Sober. No Regrets. campaign and the reason Texas law enforcement officers will increase their efforts to pull over motorists suspected of drunk driving August 19 through September 5.

On average, 1 person dies every 7 hours and 57 minutes in Texas because of a DUI-alcohol related traffic crash. Last year, 1,100 people were killed and 2,560 were seriously injured on Texas roads because someone chose to get behind the wheel after drinking.

"If you choose to celebrate the end of summer by drinking and driving, then know that police around the state will be on the lookout, will pull you over and arrest you," said TxDOT Executive Director Marc Williams. "When you drink and drive, you put everyone else on the road at risk too. These crashes are 100% preventable and can have fatal and/or serious physical, emotional and financial consequences."

Leading up to Labor Day, TxDOT is reminding everyone about the dangers of drunk driving. The campaign coincides with the national increased enforcement period sponsored by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.
