The Weather

The forecasters say there is a very slight chance for showers and storms in the Central Texas area this afternoon. Look for temperatures to climb through the end of the weekend, but triple digits are not expected.



Today: Mostly sunny with a high temperature near 95°. Winds will be NW at 5-10 mph shifting NE in the afternoon.

Main St. To enter, enter the driveway behind the fire station from 2nd St. Remember you *must have an appointment!*



District Court Notes



Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on August 14th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt.

Altogether 19 cases were brought to the court, 15 of them involved men and 4 involved women.

There was 1 defendant who failed to appear and a warrant was issued. John Carvajal, of San Antonio failed to appear on the charge of sexual assault.

There were 3 cases involving possession of a controlled substance PG1, 2 for under 1 gram, and 1 case for possession of 4-200 grams/manufacture and delivery. There was one case for possession of PG2 1-4 grams.

Felony cases for burglary of a vehicle with 2 or more convictions numbered 2. There was one case for evading w/ a vehicle and one for debit/credit card abuse.

Crimes causing personal harm included 2 for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, 3 for assault of a family/ household member and 3 for injury to a child/disabled/elderly. There was one case for continuous violence against family, one for murder and one for sexual assault.

Of the 19 cases presented to the court, 7 cases were settled with Luke Gurganus of Lampasas pleading guilty to injury to disabled, 2nd offense and sentenced to 2 years TDCJ w/ credit for days served, plus costs. Brian Mezzacappa, of Lampasas, received 10 years TDCJ-probated- plus a fine and costs for assault of a family/household member w/ previous conviction, with the condition of attending a SAFPF. Pamela Garcia, of Lipan, Texas plead guilty to aggravated assault w/deadly weapon and received 4 years probation plus court costs. Demarkus Dirden of Nolanville received 7 years probation plus court costs on the charge of possession of controlled substance PG2, 1-4 grams. Jesse Joe Garcia, of Lampasas, received 7 years probation w/ISF as a condition on each of 3 charges; one charge of assault of a family/ household member, and 2 charges of burglary of vehicle w/2 or more previous convictions.

The remainder of the cases were reset or had trials set for a future date.

Census Response Lacking in Texas

According to an article on KCEN, More than 40% of Texans have not responded to the 2020 Census.

With about seven weeks left to go and thousands of census staff still to be hired, it's a race against time and the pandemic.

"In order to get people to respond or to participate in everything, (our community is) very person-to-person, shaking hands, hugs -- we're just that kind of people," Garza-Perez said. "We weren't expecting something like the pandemic to throw our plans upside down."

To Garza-Perez, the census tells a story that helps set policy in Washington through appropriate Congressional representation. The story that helps provide the right amount of federal funding for food assistance, schools, roads and in cases of disaster, hurricanes or pandemics.

"The census tells a story about every family," she said. "It tells the story of who lives in your house. It tells a story of how many children are under-age. It tells a story of what the need is of our county. That's what the census does. And every 10 years it's our civic duty to tell that story."

"The census count really affects us in a very direct way on almost a daily basis," said Lila Valencia, a demographer at the Texas Demographic Center.

Valencia studies population, helping the state plan for the future. She said if undercounted, Texas could lose billions over the next decade.

As of Aug. 17, according to the Census Bureau, Texas is 39th in the country, with a 58.9% census response.

Valencia said Texas' current response rate is below its 2010 numbers. But 10 years ago, the state was able to catch up and account for 99% of the population by the end of the census count.

Before the coronavirus pandemic hit, the 2020 census was supposed to end in July. But in April, according to published reports, the bureau announced it was extending the timeline until October 31. And earlier this month, moving up the deadline to September 30th. According to the Census Bureau, approximately 11,000 census employees are already on the ground in Texas, going door to door to complete data collection. Garcia said about 18,000 employees are still needed state-wide. A census employee will need to undergo a background and fingerprint check, take an oath and be trained. It's very concerning that a lot of the ZIP codes that have been undercounted are also the ZIP codes that have had some of the most COVID cases," Luna said.

"Everybody who's here, whether they're here legally or illegally, but they're part of our school district, they need to be part of that canvas," she said. "They need to be painted on there. A picture needs to be there of them saying I'm part of this community. I belong."
