The Weather

Today: The high temperature will be near 9° with partly sunny skies. Winds will be S-SW at 5-10 mph.

Tonight: Look for partly cloudy skies with a low near 75°. We will have SE winds at 5-10 mph with possible gusts of 20 mph.

Commissioners Court

The Lampasas County Commissioners' Court will meet Monday, August 22nd at 9am in the Commissioners Courtroom at the Lampasas County Courthouse.

The Agenda includes: the consent agenda, accounts payable and payroll, the Lampasas County Historical Commission Distinguished Service Award, and a proposal by Areawide Locksmith regarding exterior door locking in Annex I and Annex II. The Agenda also includes a presentation by TxDOT on a Lampasas County Local Public Agency Agreement for the widening of US 183 between Lampasas and Lometa, discussion about the Old Sheriff's Office/Jail vacant lot at 410 E. 4th St., and a Memorandum of Understanding between Lampasas County and Texas A & M AgriLife extension service.

Lampasas City Council Meeting and Public Hearing

The Lampasas City Council will meet on Monday, August 22nd for regularly scheduled meetings and a public hearing at 6pm. The workshop session is scheduled to begin at 5:30pm and the agenda includes discussion regarding the City of Lampasas FY 2022/2023 budget, discussion and presentation of the Parks & Recreation Department budget, discussion regarding the terms of School Resource Officer Interlocal agreement with Lampasas ISD and the terms of the EMS Interlocal agreement with Lampasas County.

The regular session will begin at 6pm with a public hearing regarding the City Manager's Proposed Budget for the Fiscal year 2022-2023. The agenda also includes the consent agenda, boards & department monthly reports, the City Manager's Operational Report, and Mayor's comments. In New Business, there will be discussion and possible action concerning the proposed tax rate, and discussion and possible action concerning the scheduling of a public hearing regarding the proposed tax rate. Also included on the agenda is discussion and possible action regarding the terms of EMS services Interlocal agreement with Lampasas county, discussion and possible action regarding terms of School Resource Officer Interlocal agreement with Lampasas ISD, discussion and possible action regarding the procurement of two 2023 Ford Police Interceptor vehicles for School Resource Officers not to exceed \$170,000, discussion and possible action regarding a new Holt Caterpillar 926M Wheel loader and integrated tool carrier in the amount of \$237,550. There will also be discussion and possible action concerning the first reading of an ordinance amending the fee schedule for utilities water rate, providing for an increase in the rates to be charged for water service by the City of Lampasas.

Lampasas ISD Special School Board Meeting

The Lampasas ISD Board of Trustees will meet Monday, August 22nd at 6pm at the administration building for a called meeting.

The agenda includes a 2022-2023 budget hearing/tax rate hearing, the consent agenda, the 2021-2022 final budget amendments, the 2022-2023 budget for general operating fund, food service fund, and debt service fund, discussion of the CTE building and possible consultation with an attorney.

Governor's Office Assisting with School Safety

Governor Greg Abbott Wednesday announced the Governor's Public Safety Office (PSO) is accepting applications from law enforcement agencies for Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training (ALERRT) travel assistance and the Bullet-Resistant Shield Grant Program for fiscal year 2023. In June, the Governor and Texas legislative leaders transferred \$105.5 million to support additional school safety and mental health initiatives, including \$3 million for local law enforcement agencies to offset travel expenditures for ALERRT training and \$50 million for bullet-resistant shields.

"The State of Texas is working to ensure our law enforcement partners across the state are able to protect our children, teachers, and schools as the new school year begins," said Governor Abbott. "These new funds will give law enforcement officers expanded access to training for active shooter scenarios, as well as critical protective equipment. I encourage all eligible law enforcement agencies and local government entities to apply for this additional funding as we work together to keep all Texans safe."

ALERRT is designed to equip first responders with effective strategies to respond to active attack events. The ALERRT training is provided by veteran first responders with proven experience in active attack response and has served more than 200,000 first responders across the nation. Throughout Texas this summer, ALERRT has trained more than 3,000 officers, delivered dozens of classes, and is in the process of scheduling more than 100 classes in the coming months.

The Governor's PSO administers federal and state grant funding to promote strategies that improve public safety, support victims of crime, prevent terrorism, and prepare communities for the threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk to Texans.
