There is a slight chance of a shower or storm overnight and maybe lingering into tomorrow morning, but not much rain is expected.

Texas Public Schools to Post Covid-19 Data

According to an article in the Texas Tribune, Texas public schools will start posting Coronavirus case data on a state website. The process is still a work in progress, and Education Commissioner Mike Morath is waiting on input from school superintendents.

What we understand is that school districts will be required to report *confirmed* Covid-19 cases to the state within 24 hours of receiving notice of a positive test. The Texas Education Agency and the Dept. of State Health Services will gather the information. The Education Commissioner is still working on what exactly the districts will be required to report, but he did say that the state will publicly report total covid-19 numbers in schools each week. In a joint statement, the TEA & DSHS said ""This information will be submitted to DSHS any time there is a positive case in a campus community. (cont'd on back)

The Blotter



Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Thursday shows an early morning DWI reported in the 100 block of EE Ohnmeiss Dr. at 12:56am. The afternoon shows a domestic disturbance in the 600 block of Rice St. at 12:38pm. Later in the afternoon a disorderly conduct was reported in the 500 block of N. Key at 4:52pm. Suspicious persons were reported, one in the 300 block of S. Willis at 4:57pm, and one in the 1200 block of CTE at 5:39pm.

Lampasas Sheriff's blotter for Thursday shows Lometa with a welfare check. Kempner shows officers responding to animal/livestock issues. Out in the county there were animal/livestock issues, and an unattended death. Deputies went into Cove on a reported trespassing, a reported disturbance and an alarm call.

TEA is collaborating with superintendents on the reporting process and will finalize it in the coming days. As a result, it's important to note that this data collection effort will be updated based on the input received from Texas school districts."

Some districts have made the number of cases available, and some have not, choosing only to notify people who have come in contact with someone who tested positive.

Health experts say transparency from school districts, child care centers and the state is critical as parents make decisions about their children's education and well-being — and as researchers try to understand the risks of in-person education. Experts say precautionary measures — like mandatory mask-wearing, physical distancing, splitting children into small cohorts, sanitization and ventilation — are critical to keeping students and staff safe in classroom settings.

Potential for Wildfires Increasing

From the Texas A&M Forest Service we received the following : Dry air will persist over the state through the weekend, contributing to increased rates of drying in vegetation. Critically dry wildland vegetation currently observed across the landscape is very receptive to any source of ignition. This critically dry vegetation will cause wildfires to burn more intensely making these wildfires much more resistant to control. With activity and critically dry fuels, there is an elevated risk of human-caused wildfires.

A risk of dry lightning over areas in the Hill Country with critically dry vegetation on Friday night into Saturday, will increase wildfire potential.

"The potential for increased wildfire activity through the weekend is very high in the Hill Country and along the Interstate 35 corridor from Waco to New Braunfels," said Brad Smith, Texas A&M Forest

According to Les Rogers, Texas A&M Forest Service Chief of Fire Operations, state wildland firefighters have been extremely busy responding to the increase in wildfire activity

across the state. Numerous out- of-state resources are currently in Texas working together with state personnel to contain wildfires that are burning statewide. "It is crucial that all residents take care to prevent wildfires and to take measures around their home to reduce wildfire risk." said Rogers. "

Over the past seven days, state and local resources have responded to 150 fires that have burned 69,897 acres. This includes many large, multi-day fires including the still-burning McMean Fire in Sutton County at 3,921 acres and 60% contained, the Lockhart Mountain Fire in Llano County at 422 acres and 90% contained, and the Poverty Canyon Fire in Coke County at 300 acres and 80% contained.

Many of the recent wildfire starts have been attributed to human activities—such as equipment use and debris burning—and are preventable. This includes at least 80 fires that have burned 2,395 acres over the past week. Fire suppression aircraft have logged approximately 245 hours of flight time over the past week.

Efforts involved dropping 143,650 gallons of water and 94,066 gallons of retardant on multiple fires. Aviation resources staged in state include two Type 1 helicopters, two Type 3 helicopters, nine single engine air tankers, one heavy air tanker and two air attack platforms.

Aviation resources have flown 1,755 hours, dropping 1,754,867 gallons of water and retardant on Texas wildfires so far this year. Since January 1, 2020, state and local resources have responded to 3,692 fires that have burned a total of 184,774 acres.

If a wildfire is spotted, immediately contact local authorities.
