Texas Senate Passes Bill for Virtual Learning

According to a story in the Texas Tribune, with a quorum restored and legislation moving in the Texas House again, GOP lawmakers are hoping to push through a wide array of education-related bills in the next two weeks, covering issues from priorities of the socially conservative wing of the party to restoring funding so schools can offer online learning during the pandemic.

The Senate has already tackled most items on the governor's special session agenda and now it's the House that must work before the session ends in about two weeks.

At the heart of the discussion in Tuesday's hearing — as it has been since the school year started — was virtual learning funding. On a 9-1 vote, the committee passed Senate Bill 15, which would provide that funding, with some limits.

A bill that would've established and expanded virtual learning this fall died in the regular session after Texas House Democrats walked out to prevent passage of a GOP-backed elections bill that would outlaw local voting options, among several other changes.

Those against the long-term establishment of virtual learning say that students learn best in classrooms and cite declining STAAR scores during the period of virtual learning during the pandemic. Those in favor say it gives families options, especially for students who excelled in virtual learning last year and those with medical issues.

SB 15 is touted as a measure with enough guardrails to make sure students succeed and to help those who might fall through the cracks. The bill would pay for virtual learning until September 2023 and give local school districts and charter schools the autonomy to set up their own virtual learning programs. Lawmakers set the fall 2023 date to allow them to revisit the issue during their next regular session.

Ft. Hood Assisting with Afghan Refugees.

Fort Hood announced it is one of several military posts deploying troops to help installations in West Texas and Wisconsin as they house Afghan refugees.

According to a release from Fort Hood, the post will be contributing to the 1,022 service members that will help at the military posts housing evacuees at Fort McCoy, Wisconsin and Fort Bliss, Texas.. The task forces at these installations will provide housing, medical, logistics and transportation support, Fort Hood said.

The Department of Defense recently approved the request for assistance from the state department to provide temporary housing, sustenance and support for specified Afghan special immigration visa applicants, their families and other vulnerable Afghans.

"When our nation calls, III Corps and Fort Hood answer with action; our troops remain ready to respond to any mission," said Col. Myles Caggins, III Corps and Fort Hood spokesperson. "The III Corps engineers, military police, medics, and logistics soldiers—men and women—deploying to these temporary housing sites will enable the Department of State to safely and securely process the Afghan evacuees"

Coronavirus Numbers

Statewide, on August 24th, there were 15,516 new and 5,185 probable cases, along with 13,666 in the hospital. There were 199 deaths from Covid reported as well. Locally, in the last 14 days, Lampasas has seen 175 confirmed cases according to the DSHS website, with 9 being confirmed yesterday. The state estimate is 225 active cases in Lampasas County.
