Burn Ban Lifted

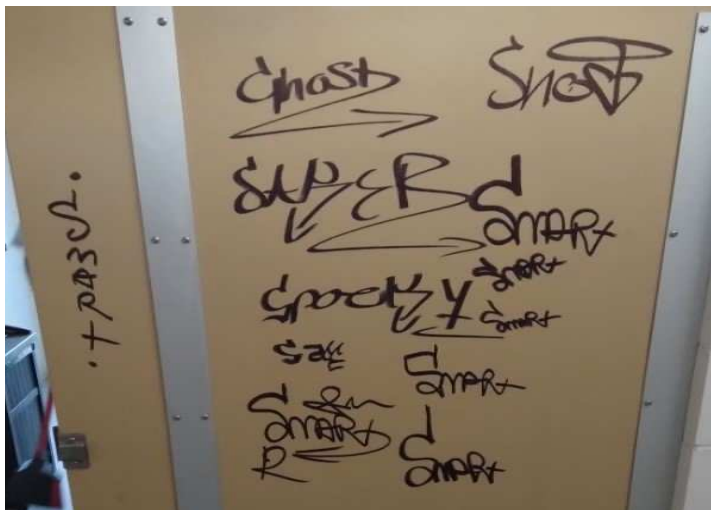
Lampasas County has lifted the burn ban effective from daylight today to sundown on September 5th. The local fire departments remind you there is no burning after dark.

Rainwater Harvesting

As water conservation enforcements continue here in parts of Central Texas, we've got a way for you to keep your yard looking lush without breaking those rules.

Rainwater harvesting has numerous benefits for your yard and your wallet.

Best used for watering plants, the natural irrigation system will also save you money when paying your water bill each month.

"Oh the benefits are mind boggling," says Kenneth Schoen, a 79-year-old Vietnam War veteran has been harvesting rainwater since 2013. He has over 1,500 gallons worth of storage tanks on his property that he uses to collect the water.

"I use it almost every day unless it's raining," said Schoen.

Using the water to nourish his plants and wash his dogs when they get muddy, Schoen is able to save money on his water bill while respecting conservation efforts.

"Your water bill is lower. I'd say that's the number one," said Teri Marceau with Texas Master Gardeners.

A 2,000 square foot house can collect 1,200 gallons of water during a one-inch rain fall.

"It's the best water for your plants because it contains no chemicals or impurities, and we highly recommend that for watering plants," said Karen Colwick with Texas Master Gardeners.

Teri and Karen are both retired but use their time to educate and help others get started with their own water harvesting system.

Creating your own water harvesting system is easy.

A typical set up consists of a rain barrel and a way for the water to enter your barrel, whether that be by an open-air system or a tube feeding the water from your roof into the barrel.

"Do what I do, just stick it under the roof line. Not even a valley, it's a straight roof like what you're seeing here like a triangle, and it collects all the water that'll fall into that barrel at that point," said Marceau.

Rain barrels reduce demand on municipal water supplies as well as reducing flooding, erosion and contamination of surface water. It's also a great use for pools, aquariums and indoor houseplants.

Grant to Plug Abandoned Oil Wells

(Texas Tribune) Texas will begin plugging about 800 abandoned oil and gas wells this fall, the state's oil and gas agency said, after receiving an initial \$25 million grant from a program included in President Joe Biden's infrastructure plan.

It's a fraction of the approximately 7,400 documented abandoned oil and gas wells that need to be plugged in the state — and industry observers believe the figure to be an undercount. Several more millions of dollars are expected to be disbursed to Texas through the newly created federal program.

Abandoned oil and gas wells leak methane, a potent greenhouse gas that is the second-largest contributor to climate change after carbon dioxide. The wells, if not properly plugged, also can leak toxic water and chemicals in the surrounding areas.

Methane lasts in the atmosphere for less time. Cutting methane emissions is one of the most effective short-term tools to reduce the effects of climate change, scientists say.

The projected cost to plug and clean up the pollution from all 7,400 documented wells is approximately \$482 million, according to the commission's notice of intent to apply for federal funding obtained by The Texas Tribune.

But an estimate from the Department of the Interior shows that Texas likely will be eligible for less than that — about \$344 million in federal funds.

The first grant of \$25 million to Texas is part of an initial award of \$560 million in 24 states. There are more than 10,000 high-priority well sites ready for remediation, according to the department's estimates based on state applications.

In a news release Friday, the commission said the federal dollars would accelerate the state's existing program to plug and clean up the abandoned oil and gas wells. In the current fiscal year, the state exceeded its goal to plug 1,000 wells in June.

In Texas, the cost to plug and restore a well ranges from \$20,000 to \$40,000, according to a previous analysis of state data by researchers at Columbia University's Center on Global Energy Policy.

Texas will start to plug wells with the initial \$25 million grant on Sept. 1, according to the commission.
