The High yesterday 96° The Low this morning 68°

The heat index reached 105° in Lampasas yesterday. The forecasters say that the storms last night moved SE, targeting our area, including Killeen which, according to the NWS has received between 3 and 4 inches of rain in the last 6 hours. The Central Texas area has received generally 1-3 inches of rain, but the rain is ongoing. The main concern this morning is the next round of storms approaching from the west, and the path they will take. Also, while we may get a break this afternoon, another round of storms is expected late tonight. The unsettled weather may last into Saturday. Look for drier, more seasonable high temperatures for the Labor Day Weekend.

Today: Showers and storms likely with a high temperature near 88°, and winds will be SE near 5-10 mph. There is an 80% chance of precipitation.

Tonight: There is a 60% chance of showers and storms, mainly very early Thursday morning, otherwise mostly cloudy skies and a low near 72°. The wind will become calm in the evening.

Thursday: The 60% chance of showers and storms continues, mostly likely in the afternoon. The skies will be mostly cloudy with a high temperature near 88°. Calm wind will become light from the S in the morning.

Thursday Night: Mostly clear and a low around 71°, and a 40% chance of showers and storms. ., Winds will become calm in the evening.

Friday: There is a 60% chance of showers and storms, with mostly cloudy skies and up to 87°. With E winds at 5 mph in the afternoon.

Vehicle Swept Away at Low Water Crossing

Lampasas Radio received the following from Lampasas Police Chief Sammy Bailey:

On September 2, 2020, Sgt. Fidel Morua, Officers Cole Nicholas, and FTO Andrew McCatherine left the scene of a house fire that had been caused by a lightning strike. They provided assistance to the family, helped locate a family pet, and assisted the Lampasas Fire Department while they extinguished the fire. Sgt. Morua along with Fire Marshal Withers then answered another lightning strike call. (The lightning strikes were at 107 N. Arnold and on CR 4765 in Kempner)

Due to the weather, as soon as the house fire was extinguished, FTO McCatherine and Officer Cole Nicholas proceeded to the low water crossing gates on Hackberry to close them.

At approximately 2:42 a.m. Officer Cole Nicholas was shutting the north side low water crossing gate in the heavy rain and

lightning when he saw another vehicle on the far south side of the low water crossing on Hackberry. He saw the vehicle approach the water on the roadway and then back up. While the vehicle was backing up he radioed to FTO McCatherine, asking if he was on the other side. FTO McCatherine advised he was not there yet. The vehicle lights then accelerated forward to the area of water and were gone. Officer Nicholas radioed that a vehicle had been swept away at the low water crossing. He ran on foot through the swift water and along Copper Springs Park and the creek area to try to locate the vehicle and occupants. Sgt. Morua and FTO McCatherine responded to the area.

Officer Nicholas could see that the headlights of the vehicle where submerged in the water and was moving swiftly with what appeared to be a female trying to climb from the vehicle out of the driver side window. His radio had been submerged in water and was not functioning properly and he had dropped his cell phone at the gate. He could see the vehicle was moving rapidly and would spin this way and that as he tried to catch up with the vehicle. FTO McCatherine, Sgt. Morua, and Lampasas Firefighters went to the bridge on East Third Street to see if they could see the vehicle and/or occupants as the water was swiftly moving in this direction. Upon arrival, FTO McCatherine could hear a faint call for help and located the vehicle at the bridge with the female sitting in the driver's side window, clinging to the vehicle as the swift water passed in and around it.

Lampasas Fire Department Firefighters Captain Corey Greiner, Colton Harrison, Shane Wolfe, and Jared Payne were able to use a ladder for Firefighter Jared Payne to conduct a swift water rescue by climbing down from the bridge to the vehicle to rescue the lone occupant from the vehicle.

Acadian Ambulance provided a medical assessment/care to the female and she was released.

The vehicle, a gray 2018 Jeep, was lifted from the water by ASAP towing with substantial damage.

I was also asked to mention the much needed assistance of Volunteer Firefighters, Sean Kapmire and Vince Rodgers.

This was a great job by all in the rescue.



The Blotter



Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Tuesday shows a suspicious person in the 1700 block of CTE at 6:26am, a suspicious vehicle in the 2300 block of 281S at 8:29am, and a burglary of a habitation in the 500 block of N. Roads Closed

Rainfall totals in the area varied a great deal. Burnet saw only .28 inches, Hamilton 1.58 inches, west of Lampasas Airport 4 inches and counting, The Colorado River at Bend 2.06 inches, Ft. Hood 2.78 inches, a resident north of Kempner is showing over 6 inches in his rain gauge, and San Saba .43 inches.



According to the Lampasas Police Department, the Third Street bridge, in about the 1000 block of East Third street, is closed until further notice. Third at Hackberry and at Milligan are closed. The Hackberry Street low water crossings are closed. The water is crossing the roadway on Hackberry Street from low water areas at East 2nd to East Avenue A. Avoid these areas and take safe detours.

From Lampasas ISD:

Dr. Chane Rascoe contacted Lampasas Radio this morning with an update on home football games.

Beginning with the sub-varsity games tomorrow, LISD will need to reduce the capacity at Badger Field.

* For the reduced capacity, LISD will only be able to accommodate 700 people on the home side, and 600 on the visitor's side.

*Every other row will be blocked off, and spectators will only be able to sit in every other row.

*Social distancing MUST be observed.

*Masks MUST be worn by spectators.

*Spectators will be screened when entering the stadium.

*Spectators may stand at the fence, if social distancing is observed, if they are not comfortable in the stands.

*Tickets will be sold in the same manner as before, with online sales for participants parents beginning Monday morning, season ticket holders Tuesday mornings, and the remainder will be sold on Wednesday morning.
