## The Weather

Showers and storms are expected across much of our area today, with heavy rain possible. The shower activity should decrease over night. ## It's Friday! What's Goin' on? Social Distancing



The Lampasas Badgers Varsity Football team heads for Stephenville today, to take on the Yellow Jackets at Tarleton University's Memorial Stadium. Last week the Yellow Jackets won at Sweetwater, 58-32, with a total offense of 535 yards, 340 rushing and 195 passing. Stephenville wants to "make him uncomfortable", talking about Ace, who has a propensity for turning average plays into big ones.

The Badgers are currently ranked #3 in class 4A, with Stephenville at #11. The Badger lineup has quiet a few seniors, and the line averages 285 pounds. Look for Ace to throw to Mike Murray, and Jack Jerome for some running yards. Case Brister will head up the defense.

### Changes Abound for Spectators



According to an article in the Austin-American Statesman, When the UIL announced it would go ahead with football season, there were no guarantees all games would be played. The University Interscholastic League takes COVID-19 seriously. It began by limiting stadium capacity to 50%. There are stipulations that fans must wear masks and maintain proper social distancing. Multiple signs at venues throughout the state urge fans to follow these

guidelines. The Canyon Lake-Wimberley game was just one example of fans ignoring the signs and public address announcements on the subject. The same held true in Lampasas, Burnet and many other venues in Texas. UIL officials took note of videos and photographs of large crowds on social media and responded swiftly. This week they reposted mandatory guidelines on their website.

Including

*"Executive Order GA-29, regarding face coverings, applies to all UIL activities effective July 3, 2020. This includes the 2020-2021 school year. As the public health situation changes, and/or if subsequent Executive Orders are issued by Governor Greg Abbott, these guidelines may be further modified.*

According to UIL guidelines, penalties for disobeying these guidelines range from simple reprimands to shutting down sports. Although games last week were played mostly in small communities, the coronavirus does not only hit big cities such as Houston, Dallas, San Antonio and Austin.

Take Burnet County, which has a population of roughly 48,000 people, announced it has had 670 confirmed cases and 12 deaths attributed to the virus. Lampasas County, which has 21,248 people, reports 154 confirmed cases and six deaths related to COVID-19.

For tonight's game, don't be surprised to see changes to stadium seating. Superintendents, principals and coaches have been notified by the UIL. Many schools, including Lampasas ISD are making the unpopular decision to block off every other row in the stands, and reduce capacity. In Lampasas at Badger Field they will now only accommodate 700 people on the home side and 600 on the visitor side. The following was put out by Dr. Rascoe, Superintendent of Lampasas ISD:

Beginning with the sub-varsity games today, LISD will need to reduce the capacity at Badger Field.

*\* For the reduced capacity, LISD will only be able to accommodate 700 people on the home side, and 600 on the visitor's side.*

*\*Every other row will be blocked off, and spectators will only be able to sit in every other row.*

*\*Social distancing MUST be observed.*

*\*Masks MUST be worn by spectators.*

*\*Spectators will be screened when entering the stadium.*

*\*Spectators may stand at the fence, if social distancing is observed, if they are not comfortable in the stands.*





## Plan While You Can

**AUSTIN** — While there may be less traffic on the roads this Labor Day weekend, TxDOT is urging those who choose to go out and celebrate to plan ahead for a sober ride before any drinking begins. “We encourage people to enjoy the long weekend, but to do so responsibly,” said TxDOT



Executive Director James Bass. “If you plan to drink alcohol and go out, make the plan for a sober ride. It’s an easy decision that can prevent senseless tragedies and save lives.” During last year’s Labor Day holiday weekend\* in Texas, there were 382 crashes involving drivers under the influence of alcohol. Those crashes killed 12 people and seriously injured another 55.

The “Plan While You Can” campaign aims to save lives and reduce preventable crashes by reminding drivers to make a plan for a sober ride if they are drinking alcohol. Leading up to the Labor Day holiday, the campaign shares this message through

TV and radio public service announcements, social media, digital ads and billboards.

Driving under the influence of alcohol risks death or serious injuries. It can also be costly. Drivers can face up to \$17,000 in fines and fees, jail time and loss of their driver’s license. Instead of getting behind the wheel if you’ve been drinking, here are some other options:

- Designate a sober driver.
  - Contact a cab or ride-share service.
- Spend the night.

In addition to having a sober ride, if you plan to go out this holiday weekend, follow the guidance of health officials, and maintain social distance, wear a mask and remember to wash your hands.
