The Weather



The High yesterday 79° The Low this morning 69°

It felt like the long awaited fall outside our door this morning.

Rainfall totals in the area Tuesday through Friday: Lampasas – 5.48 in. Bend – 5.19 in. Lometa – 7.35 in. San Saba – 4.55 in. Goldthwaite - .79 in. Hamilton – 4.14 in. Gatesville – 4.64 in. Killeen – 3.19 in.

Today: A 40% chance of more rain, mainly early this afternoon, otherwise some occasional sunshine peeking out from the clouds. The high should be about 85° with calm to 5 mph breezes becoming E-NE this morning.

Tonight: Mostly cloudy with a low around 69° and light E-SE breeze turning calm.

Sunday: Mostly sunny with a high near 89° and calm wind becoming S-SE at 5 mph in the afternoon. Overnight it will get down to about 70°.

Next Week: Labor Day Monday will bring sunshine that turns to warm, at about 90°, in the afternoon. The wind will be S-SW at 5-10 mph. Overnight it will be mostly cloudy and down to around 71°.

On Tuesday the rain chances will return and stay with us through perhaps Thursday.

Coronavirus Update



As of yesterday, there were 85,375 estimated active cases of the virus in Texas. The numbers continue to fall, hopefully pointing to an end in sight as far as COVID-19. There are currently just over 13,000 fatalities in the state so far.

Here locally, Lampasas County is reporting 274 total cases in the county. The number of *active* cases is 22, with 9 fatalities. There are currently no hospitalizations. The total number of confirmed cases also includes those who have recovered.

Rain, Rain, Go Away



After nearly 3 straight days of nothing but lightening, thunder, and a lot of pouring rain, you will be happy to know that it is forecasted to be a light drizzle until Monday. A total of 5.48 inches of rain have fallen over the course of this week in Lampasas. This week has brought us flash floods, one of which resulting in a car being swept away. Plan While You Can



AUSTIN — While there may be less traffic on the roads this Labor Day weekend, TxDOT is urging those who choose to go out and celebrate to plan ahead for a sober ride before any drinking begins. "We encourage people to enjoy the long weekend, but to do so responsibly," said TxDOT Executive Director James Bass. "If you plan to drink alcohol and go out, make the plan for a sober ride. It's an easy decision that can prevent senseless tragedies and save lives."

During last year's Labor Day holiday weekend* in Texas, there were 382 crashes involving drivers under the influence of alcohol. Those crashes killed 12 people and seriously injured another 55. The "Plan While You Can" campaign aims to save lives and reduce preventable crashes by reminding drivers to make a plan for a sober ride if they are drinking alcohol. Leading up to the Labor Day holiday, the campaign shares this message through TV and radio public service announcements, social media, digital ads and billboards.

Driving under the influence of alcohol risks death or serious injuries. It can also be costly. Drivers can face up to \$17,000 in fines and fees, jail time and loss of their driver's license. Instead of getting behind the wheel if you've been drinking, here are some other options:

- Designate a sober driver.
 - Contact a cab or ride-share service.
- Spend the night.


