USDA Funding Internet in Rural Texas Towns

According to a story from KWTX, the U.S. Department of Agriculture wants small towns in Central Texas to get their hands on some of the \$1.2 billion of federal funding available for better internet access. According to state USDA officials, the COVID-19 pandemic uncovered holes about which Texans have access to broadband: it showed many people living in small towns are being left behind.

"We saw so many issues during the COVID pandemic when people weren't connected and their access to education, and we're also about commerce," said Lillian Salerno, USDA Rural Development State Director in Texas. "We think America, and Texas, thrives with the more business they have, and we want people to live in rural America who are able to start businesses." However, in order to start businesses, they need strong, reliable internet, she says.

"We like the fact, as a country, that people want to live outside of cities," said Salerno. "Not everyone can live in the city, and we think there's creatives and other folks, and certainly people agriculture, which is our agency, that we need living out in these territories where we grow our food, and in order to do that, we've got to get access to internet or we're not going to grow these communities."

Starting this week, Central Texas cities, counties, businesses and non-profit organizations can apply for federal money to build-out the internet infrastructure in their rural areas. "They can apply through the government to have loans and grants so they can build-out their internet," said Salerno. \$1.2 billion from the President Biden's Infrastructure Law is allotted to increase access to high-speed internet for people living in small towns across America. (cont'd from front) Rep. Roger Williams, who represents Texas' 25th Congressional District, says he's been working for a long time to bring better internet access to rural communities. "For years I have worked in Congress to end the digital divide between rural and urban America," Williams told KWTX in a statement. "Access to broadband has become essential to anyone running a small business, accessing telemedicine services, or wanting flexibility in their children's education."

The most recent round of Reconnect Program funding, round three, brought close to \$10 million to rural Central Texas in the form of a fiber network which will connect hundreds of people, farms and businesses to high-speed internet in Lampasas and San Saba counties.

"For too long the rural community has been left behind in the digital age, and I am proud to see federal dollars coming to Lampasas, Texas to expand broadband services," said Williams.

Ft. Hood Soldiers Testing New Explosives

FORT HOOD, Texas — Engineer Soldiers just completed testing the Army's newest explosive that will help them shape the battlefield.

Sappers from the 59th Combat Engineer Company – Armored (CEC-A), 36th Engineer Brigade learned how to employ the XM204 Top Attack Munition, the first of its kind in Soldier hands.

The XM204 Top Attack Munition is a hand-emplaced explosive that can detect enemy vehicles, shoot an explosive submunition into the air that fires a projectile capable of destroying vehicles in the blast area, according to Mr. Mitch Hackman, an Operations Research Systems Analyst (ORSA) at the U.S. Army Operational Test Command (OTC).

"The XM204 Operational Assessment provided a great opportunity for the organization to continue to refine our critical mission essential tasks while enhancing our Soldiers' lethality and providing feedback in support of Army modernization priorities," said Capt. Abraham Orozco.

During six days of testing, Orozco's Soldiers conducted missions against an operationally realistic enemy in both day and night conditions. They planned and emplaced nearly 20 obstacles of varying types that included traditional wire obstacles and mine fields, to test the XM204's ability to destroy an enemy or alter their route.

Ultimately, test data and Soldier feedback collected during the test will inform Senior Army leaders on their decision to move forward with full-rate production.

Master Sgt. Jonathan Stevenson, OTC's Maneuver Support and Sustainment Test Directorate NCOIC and Combat Engineer with nearly 20 years of experience said the XM204 is an important new capability for the Army. "The XM204 provides Combat Engineers with a semi-flexible smart munition that can be utilized to shape the battlefield and will ultimately enhance the ability of our Soldiers to destroy the enemy," he said.
