## The Weather



The High yesterday 88° The Low this morning 73°

Lampasas County is under a flood advisory until 12:30pm.

The forecasters say that the widespread rain and storms should continue into the evening and are slated to continue into the overnight hours. A cluster of showers and storms is expected to develop mid-morning and drift north this afternoon. With the incoming moisture bringing the rain this morning, and the development of showers and storms, training storms are possible creating localized flooding. After the cold front passes, temperatures are expected to drop then remain steady. As for the timing of the front, it should be near I-35 at sunset, then move through the state overnight. The coldest air will be in northwest Texas with near-normal temperatures in southeast Texas.

**Today:** Showers and storms likely with a high temperature near 80°, and winds will be SE near 10 mph. There is a 90% chance of precipitation.

**Tonight:** The 90% chance of showers and storms continues. Otherwise cloudy skies and a low near 60°. The wind will become from the north early in the morning. 1-2 inches of rain possible.

**Thursday:** There is a 70% chance of showers and storms. The skies will be cloudy with a high temperature near 71°. Winds will be from the N at 10 mph.

**Thursday Night:** Mostly cloudy with a low around 63°, and a 20% chance of showers and storms. Winds will be N-NW near 10 mph.

**Friday:** There is a 20% chance of showers and storms, with mostly cloudy skies and up to 79°. Winds will be N near 10 mph.

**Friday Night:** Mostly cloudy skies and a low near 66°. Winds will be NE at 5-10 mph becoming calm.

## City Manager Notes



Lampasas City Manger Finley de Graffenried was in Lampasas Radio studios this morning for his weekly visit with Ronnie Witcher.

They spoke about the ongoing after-effects of the lightning storm(s) last week. The City Manager

said that some feeds from sub-stations were affected, and there were isolated cases of homes with power outages lasting 1-1 ½ hours. We are still dealing with the after effects here at the radio station as well. Ronnie would like to give kudos to the city electric crews for all their work in the inclement weather and for helping us out at the radio station yesterday as well.

Mr. de Graffenried also said that as of yesterday, (what a difference a day makes) all the low water crossings were open.

However at print time, Lampasas County is under a current flood advisory until 12:30pm.

There was a special called meeting of the Lampasas City Council yesterday evening which included a public hearing on the proposed tax rate for the next budget cycle. The tax rate will stay the same, however, if the valuation of your property increases

your taxes will go up. Mr. de Graffenried explained that the city has nothing to do with the valuation of your house, that is decided by the Central Appraisal District. The first reading of the approved FY 2020-2021 Lampasas City Budget will be next Monday, September 14<sup>th</sup> at the City Council Meeting.

Yesterday's meeting also brought up the subject of a skate park, and what locations might work. The Council expects to hear back from them next Monday. When asked about the Cooper Springs park, the City Manager explained that it is a "natural area" with primitive trails and many people enjoy it. There is a management agreement with the Cooper Springs board. The city is looking at parking possibilities on Hackberry St. for the natural area.

The rain is putting the City behind on the West Ave E project, and the next project will be new wastewater lines on West Ave. C.

## Ft. Hood Under Investigation

According to the Texas Tribune, Congressional subcommittees will investigate Fort Hood's leadership after a string of deaths at the military base.

"Where appropriate, we intend to seek justice on behalf of those in uniform," the subcommittee chairs said while announcing their probe of the Texas Army base.

Two congressional subcommittees are investigating the leadership at Fort Hood following a series of deaths and instances of sexual abuse and harassment.

The House Oversight and Reform Committee's Subcommittee on National Security and the House Armed Services Subcommittee on Military Personnel said they are seeking documents and information about how Fort Hood's leadership has responded to a series of deaths and instances of sexual harassment and abuse. Stephen Lynch, D-Mass., and Jackie Speier, D-Calif., wrote in a letter to Army Secretary Ryan McCarthy.

Spc. Vanessa Guillen went missing in April and her body was found near the Leon River in July. The soldier suspected of killing Guillen, Spc. Aaron Robinson, killed himself as police tried to arrest him.

Guillen was the victim of sexual harassment, her sister said, but she didn't report the sexual harassment out of fear of retaliation.

The Army in June opened an independent review of base leadership's handling of her case.

Lynch and Speier also mentioned Pvt. Gregory Wedel-Morales, a private at Fort Hood whose body was found in June, nearly a year after he went missing in August 2019.

Investigations into two additional deaths, of Pvt. Mejhor Morta and Sgt. Elder Fernandes, are ongoing. Authorities are also probing the deaths of Pfc. Brandon Scott Rosecrans, Spc. Freddy Delacruz Jr. and Spc. Shelby Tyler Jones.

Both Guillen and Fernandes were allegedly sexually abused or harassed prior to their deaths.

While the Army has directed an independent review of Fort Hood, Congressional oversight is necessary to determine whether base leadership — by omission or commission — has allowed or enabled a culture to exist that undermines the values and traditions of the U.S. Army," the committee chairs wrote. Between 2014 and 2019, an average of 129 felonies were committed annually at Fort Hood, including murder, kidnapping and sexual assault, according to the letter. McCarthy acknowledged during a press briefing in August that the base had "the most cases for sexual assault and harassment and murders for our entire formation of the U.S. Army."
