The Weather

The high yesterday 78° This morning's low 53°
(The temperature dropped from 78° to 66° in 20 minutes at 2:35pm)

The stronger than advertised cold front moved through, leaving cooler than expected temperatures, with some locations in the high 40's. Dallas set a new record low minimum record at 55°. Scattered showers have moved through, and the rain should diminish. Temperatures are expected to top out in the 60's in our area and the 70's to our east. The near or below temperatures are expected to last through the beginning of next week.

Today: Cloudy and a wonderful 65° high temperature this afternoon. There is a 50% chance of showers this morning. Wind will be from the N at 10-15 mph.

Tonight: Cloudy, with a low around 61° and winds from the N at 10 mph.

Friday: Cloudy, with decreasing clouds and a high near 76°. The wind will continue from the N at about 10 mph.

Overnight Friday: Partly cloudy with a low near 65°. The wind will become calm.

Saturday: Mostly sunny with high temperatures near 87°. Winds will be light from the north.

Saturday night: Look for partly cloudy skies and a low near 68°, with light E-NE winds.

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on September 4th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt.

Altogether 17 cases were brought to the court, 13 of them involved men and 4 involved women. There were 2 defendants that failed to appear, Damian Altimirano of Killeen failed to appear on the charge of evading arrest with a vehicle, and Stephen Denmon failed to appear on the charge of indecency with a child/sexual contact. Warrants were issued.

There were 4 cases involving possession of a controlled substance PG1; 3 for under 1 gram, and 1 case for possession of 4-200 grams. There was one case for burglary of a building. There was one case for accident involving injury, one for credit/debit card abuse, one for unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon, and 3 for evading arrest with a vehicle.

Crimes causing personal harm included 1 case of assault of a family/household member, one for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, and one for murder. There were 2 cases of indecency w/child sexual contact, and one case of continuous sexual abuse of a person under 14 years old.

Of the 17 cases presented to the court, one of the cases was settled with Chayo Boy Rendon of Lampasas receiving 3 years probation on the charge of assault of a family/household member/impeding breathing; the charge of credit/debit card abuse for Mr. Rendon was abandoned/dismissed. The remainder of the cases were reset or had trials set for a future date.

Additional Unemployment Benefits Ending

Texans receiving unemployment benefits who qualified for an extra \$300 in weekly jobless payments issued by the Trump administration will no longer receive the additional funds after claims from last week are paid, according to the Texas Workforce Commission. The agency, which processes unemployment claims, said in a news release Wednesday afternoon it had been notified of the news by the Federal Emergency Management Agency, which provided the funds. Roughly 1.8 million Texans currently receive the \$300 payment, according to the workforce commission.

It's unclear whether more federal relief could be on the way for unemployed Texans. According to a report by The Washington Post on Wednesday, White House officials were considering an additional round of executive actions, including one to address unemployment benefits.

In August, President Donald Trump announced the extra weekly payments after an additional \$600 weekly payment approved by Congress to help offset losses tied to the pandemic expired in July. The Trump administration said the federal government would provide \$300 per week and that states could decide whether to contribute an additional \$100, which Texas did not do. The state applied for federal funding roughly two weeks after the president issued his order.

After news of the additional funding was made, the workforce commission said over 347,000 Texans receiving unemployment benefits would not qualify for the additional \$300 weekly payment as of Aug. 24. A spokesperson for the agency said some people did not qualify because they did not indicate they had lost their jobs because of the pandemic when they filed for unemployment. Others did not qualify because they were receiving less than \$100 in weekly unemployment benefits.


