The Anniversary of 9/11

(CBS News) An annual ceremony to remember those who died on September 11, 2001, is being held in lower Manhattan today, 22 years after the World Trade Center's Twin Towers collapsed in the deadliest terror attack on U.S. soil. Nearly 3,000 people were killed after four planes were hijacked by attackers from the Al Qaeda terrorist group.

The first plane, American Airlines Flight 11, crashed into the World Trade Center's North Tower at 8:46am. At 9:03am the second plane, United Airlines Flight 175, hit the World Trade Center's South Tower. Both towers soon collapsed — the South Tower just before 10am, then the North Tower a half-hour later. American Airlines Flight 77 hit the Pentagon at 9:37am, and at 10:03 a.m., United Flight 93 crashed into a field in Shanksville, Pennsylvania.

Less than 30 minutes later, United Airlines Flight 93 — the fourth plane downed in the terror attack — crashed into a field in Pennsylvania. That plane had been hijacked and was heading to Washington, D.C., but never made it after passengers were pushed to the back of the plane by hijackers, then took a vote and decided to try to regain control of the aircraft, according to the Friends of Flight 93 National Memorial. A struggle ensued, and the plane eventually crashed in an open area.

Memorial observances are being held at the Pentagon and in Shanksville Pennsylvania Monday morning.

Badger Football

The Lampasas Badgers Varsity routed the Eastview Patriots Friday night at Badger Stadium 72-37, which, according to Sportscaster Mike Barnes is "the most points Lampasas has scored in a game in at least the last 43 years".

Reed Jerome was 22 for 29 at quarterback with 293 yards and 4 touchdowns, and rushed for 100 yards on 9 carries and 2 touchdowns. J. Posten was 2 for 2 at quarterback with 24 yards and a touchdown. Jett Walker had 15 carries for 166 yards and 2 touchdowns, and K. Reed had 15 carries for 51 yards. Haegan Oncken had 2 carries for 20 yards and 4 receptions for 59 yards and a touchdown.

Bryson Roberts brought in 6 catches for 105 yards and a touchdown. T. Johnson had 7 receptions for 89 yards and 2 touchdowns and Preston Isom had 3 catches for 34 yards and a touchdown.

The Badgers travel Thursday night to Pflugerville Connally where the Cougars were 7 of 13 in passing for 154 yards Friday against Mc Callum in a 56-42 win. However, they seem to be strong in rushing with 359 yards Friday night, and notably, 250 of those yards were racked up by senior J.
