The Weather

It looks like a nice weekend in store, as a cooler drier airmass moves into the region. Temperatures are expected to be a bit below normal, with Saturday high temperatures in the mid 80's. However, the forecasters are keeping an eye on the tropical system in the Gulf of Mexico. While there is a decent possibility that some outer rain bands will reach Central Texas, the main effect will be increasing clouds and lower daytime temperatures.

Today: Mostly sunny with a high near 84°. Wind will be from the N-NE at 5-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Tonight: Mostly clear skies and a low near 63°, with NE wind at 5-10 mph.

Saturday: Sunny with a high temperature near 81° and a NE wind at 5-15 mph.

Saturday night: Look for clear skies with a low near 57°. Winds will continue NE at 5-10 mph.

Sunday: Sunny with a high near 82°. Winds will be NE at 5-15 mph.

Sunday Night: Partly cloudy and 64°. Winds will be NE at 5-10 mph. There is a 20% chance of showers.

Remains Found in Lampasas County



Lampasas Radio received the following press release from the Lampasas County Sheriff's Department:

"At 1:43 PM, the Lampasas Sheriff's Office received a call from the Copperas Cove Police Department advising of a vehicle fire in the vicinity of the 2002 block West U.S. Highway 190. The vehicle, a four door Ford pickup truck located in a lower gravel pit behind a cement business was observed to be completely burned and extinguished. There appeared to be charred remains in the drivers seat. No positive identification of the remains or the vehicle could be made at the scene. Copperas Cove Police Department, the Texas Rangers and the Lampasas Police Department assisted the Lampasas Sheriff's Office with the processing of the crime scene and drone photography. A semi-automatic pistol was found in the driver's seat next the remains. Lampasas County Justice of Peace Greg Chapman responded and ordered an autopsy to determine if they were human remains and to determine a DNA identification. The vehicle was secured for further processing. This investigation will continue to determine a positive identification of the remains and of the registered owner of the vehicle."

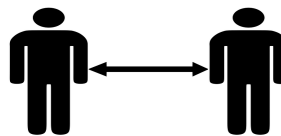

A possession of drug paraphernalia call came in from the 700 block of S. Key at 10:01pm. Bernard Uhler II, 46 was arrested in the 300 block of S. Willis St. at 10:39pm on a Lampasas PD warrant for assault/family violence/causing bodily injury. A Suspicious vehicle was reported in the 2300 block of 580W at 10:39pm and a suspicious person was reported in the 900 block of E. Ave D at 11:57pm.

Lampasas Sheriff's blotter for Thursday shows Lometa with an early morning accident. Kempner shows livestock/animal issues, reports of suspicious activity and a medical call. Out in the county there was a reported criminal mischief, civil matters, reports of suspicious activity, and a medical call. Deputies went into Cove on a reported theft, an animal issue and a report of an abandoned vehicle (see story).

The County-Wide Burn Ban is lifted until Monday at 5pm.

Another person called to report they were notified that they had won 25 million dollars from Publisher's Clearing House but first they had to pay IRS taxes/fees of less than a thousand dollars to receive the 25 million dollars.

2. You never pay to receive legitimate winnings. Nope, you don't pay taxes, IRS, or for them to hold the money until it can safely be delivered to you. Plus taxes on 25 million dollars would be a lot more than \$850.00.

3. Never give confidential information. No address, no banking information, driver license information, social security, or any other confidential information.

4. If you receive a check in the mail, it might look legitimate, but it could be a fraud. You can have law enforcement or the bank check it for you.

5. Publisher's Clearing House can be contacted directly, not by the number or email the Scammer provides. Scammers often use fake information and stolen information to try to trick people.

Updated Long Term Care Visitation

The Governor announced new visitation guidance for eligible nursing homes, assisted living facilities, intermediate care facilities, home and community-based service providers, and inpatient hospice effective Thursday, September 24th. Under the new rules, residents will be allowed to designate up to two essential family caregivers who will be provided necessary training to allow them to safely go inside a facility for a scheduled visit, including in the resident's room, to help ensure their loved one's physical, social, and emotional needs are being met. Designated caregivers will not be required to maintain physical distancing, but only one caregiver can visit a resident at a time. The caregiver must test negative for COVID-19 within the previous 14 days before the visit. .
