The Coronavirus Report



With schools opening up and restrictions loosening on masks, we've seen a jump in numbers as far as COVID-19. There are currently 309 total cases, with 279 recovered. There are 20 active cases, and 10 fatalities. It is advised by health officials and the Fire Chief to continue wearing masks, washing hands, and staying socially distanced.

Unemployment Relief in Texas

From the Texas Tribune — The coronavirus pandemic has steered the economy into a recession. In Texas, the state's unemployment rate remains nearly double what it was at the start of the year, and nearly 3.5 million people have filed for unemployment relief since mid-March. The week ending September 12, a total of 49,644 Texans filed initial applications for unemployment relief. On Aug. 6, the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas said the state will recover some of the lost jobs during the rest of the year, "but not enough to overcome the sharp declines in March and April."

Texas' sales tax revenues — the largest source of funding for the state budget — have created a shortfall that officials will have to fill. The state's outdated and understaffed unemployment insurance office has left countless Texans confused and without

unemployment benefits. An extra \$600 weekly unemployment payment that was part of a federal relief bill expired in July. In August, the state received federal funding to provide an extra \$300 every week for people who have lost their jobs. However, nearly 350,000 unemployed Texans didn't qualify for the extra benefit, and the payments ended in September. When eviction moratoriums were lifted in July, unemployed renters faced a system that housing attorneys — and some eviction judges — say is already stacked against tenants. In September, the federal government announced a nationwide eviction moratorium that could protect millions of Texans from being evicted. Economists say weakened oil prices, high unemployment and the ongoing public health crisis will slow Texas' economic recovery.





The Blotter



Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Friday shows a reported fraud in the 200 block of N. Key Ave. at 10:10 am. At 11:46 am, a suspicious person was reported in the 1000 block of S. Key Ave.

The afternoon shows suspicious activity reported in the 1700 block of E. Ave. J at 12:17 pm. There was also a domestic disturbance reported in the 1100 block of E. 4th St. at 2:52 pm. Evening shows a theft reported in the 600 block of N. Key Ave. at 5:00 pm, and yet another suspicious activity reported at 5:42 pm in the 11 block of W North Ave. This was almost immediately followed by a suspicious person reported in the 300 block of W 3rd St. Then, at 7:57 pm, in the 1500 block of S Main St, a runaway was reported.

A theft was reported in the 300 block of W. Ave. A at 8:23 pm, and the day ended with a reported disturbance in the 200 block of W. Ave. A at 11:00 pm.

Lampasas Sheriff's Blotter shows a good bit of activity in Kempner, starting the day with a medical call in the wee hours of the morning, and then another followed only an hour later. A reported fraud took place around 10 am that morning, and an animal problem was reported at 11:06am. 3 minutes later, a disturbance was reported. Kempner ended the day with a reckless driver at 2:09 pm and a civil matter at 5:59 pm.

Lampasas shows a medical call very early in the morning, around 12:53 am. Later in the day, a traffic stop took place at 2:48 pm. Later that evening, a medical call was reported at 5:01 pm, followed by a reckless driver at 5:30 pm. Lampasas ended reports with a noise complaint at 10:14pm.

Copperas Cove had a reported traffic hazard early that morning, followed by an alarm two hours later. A trespassing was reported at 1:32 pm, and then a 911 contact at 9:14pm.

The Burn Ban is active until the 21st at 5pm.

the nation recognizes National Child Passenger Safety week from Sept. 20-26. The campaign highlights the fact that an alarming number of car seats are being installed and used incorrectly. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), 59% of all child car seats are being misused. This is even more alarming given that vehicle crashes are a leading cause of death among children in the nation.

"When child car seats are installed correctly they keep children as safe as possible during a crash," TxDOT Executive Director James Bass said. "We urge parents and caregivers to ensure they are securing their children properly in a vehicle and using the appropriate child car seat for their child's age and size."

TxDOT is continuing its free safety seat inspections throughout the year, but this year they've gone virtual. Starting this month, we will be rolling out virtual car seat checks to enable us to maintain the same level of

service and provide education to families while following social distancing guidelines due to COVID-19. For a one-on-one TxDOT virtual car seat check, families can visit [SaveMeWithaSeat.org](https://www.txdot.gov/save-me-with-a-seat) and enter their zip code to email the nearest TxDOT Traffic Safety Specialist to set up an also learn if a child should be in a rear-facing car seat, a forward-facing car seat or a booster seat, and get other car seat safety tips by visiting the website.

This year's "Save Me With a Seat" campaign features a branded truck that will traverse Texas, covering more than 3,000 miles, visiting six cities to bring the car seat safety message to communities across the state. The truck will be a no-contact experience with the driver utilizing COVID-19 safety precautions including a mask and gloves. The awareness effort will be supported by radio ads, billboards, digital media and social media. In 2019, 77 children younger than 8 years old died in traffic crashes in Texas, and 26 of those were unrestrained at the time of the crash. Among children ages 8-12 in 2019, 42 died in traffic crashes, with 18 of them unrestrained at the time of the crash.

According to NHTSA, child car seats in passenger vehicles can reduce the risk of fatal injury in a crash by 71% for infants and by 54% for toddlers.

TxDOT reminds drivers that Texas law requires all children under 8 — unless they are taller than 4 feet, 9 inches — to be in a car seat whenever they ride in a passenger vehicle. Failure to properly restrain a child can result in a ticket of up to \$250. Children under age 13 should ride in the back seat, properly secured in a seat belt or safety seat.

"Save Me With a Seat" is a key component of [#EndTheStreakTX](https://www.txdot.gov/save-me-with-a-seat), a broader social media and word-of-mouth effort that encourages drivers to make safer choices while behind the wheel, like wearing a seat belt, driving the speed limit, never texting and driving and never driving under the influence of alcohol or other drugs. Nov. 7, 2000 was the last deathless day on Texas roadways. #EndTheStreakTX asks all Texans to commit to driving safely to help end the streak of daily deaths.
