The Weather



The High yesterday 79° The Low this morning 69°

As the moisture moves in from Tropical Storm Beta, the rainbands are spreading northwestward and the forecasters say there should be scattered showers increasing in coverage. The energy from Beta is expected to meet up with a weather system that could result in multi-inch rainfall. However, at this time, it is difficult to predict were the heavier rainfall would be. This will be monitored by the NWS. A return to mostly sunny skies and seasonable temperatures is expected toward the end of the week. Our next cold front is expected to move through on Sunday making for a very nice few days.

Today: Look for cloudy skies and a 40% chance of showers this afternoon. high near 86°. Winds will be N-NE at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Tonight: : A 70% chance of precipitation, with cloudy skies and a low temperature near 65°. Winds will continue to be N-NE at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Tuesday Cloudy with a high near 73° and a 60% chance of rain with storms possible in the afternoon. Winds will be N near 10 mph.

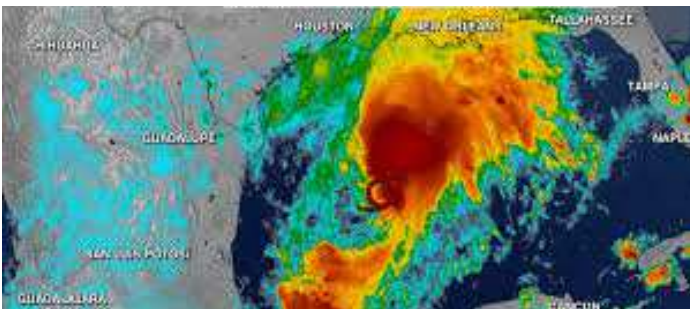

Tropical Storm Beta Impacting Texas

On his website, Governor Greg Abbott urged Texans to remain vigilant and closely monitor weather conditions as Tropical Storm Beta is expected to impact parts of the Gulf Coast this



week. The State of Texas has the appropriate assets in place to respond and assist communities with potential flooding and heavy rainfall. The Texas Division Of Emergency Management (TDEM) and the State Operations Center (SOC) continue to monitor weather conditions and coordinate with the National Weather Service and their West Gulf River Forecast Center. The

SOC has been activated to Level II (Escalated Response Conditions) in support of the ongoing response to COVID-19 and Tropical Storm Beta.

While TS Beta is small, it is already bringing coastal flooding from the storm surge, which is expected to be much worse at high tide. the Texas Coast today. A Tropical Storm warning, and a storm surge warning is in effect for much of the Texas Coast and part of the Louisiana Coast.

This morning, Beta was located 100 mile SW of Galveston moving west at 5 mph with winds of 50 mph. It appears that Beta is becoming disorganized, however, the Texas Coast will still be impacted. Showers and thunderstorms from Beta are affecting parts of Louisiana and Texas right now. The storm is expected to make landfall later today or tonight. After landfall, the storm is expected to move slowly north then northeast.

Coronavirus Update

There are currently 309 total cases, with 279 recovered. There are 21 active cases, and 10 fatalities. According to Dr. Georgia Hay, the Lampasas County Health authority, there is one more active case, with more cases coming in, but Dr. Hay did not have a total this morning.

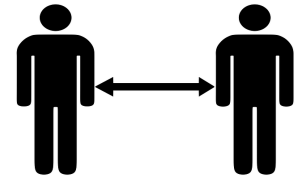

Accident Caused by Driver Fatigue

According to a story from KWTX, Driver fatigue appears to be behind a rollover crash in Lampasas County, according to state troopers. (below)



The crash happened Sunday morning on FM 2657 in Lampasas County, where according to Troopers with the Texas Dept. of Public Safety, a 2020 GMC Acadia was driving southbound when the 23-year-old behind the wheel failed to drive in a single lane, crossed into the northbound lane, and left the roadway. Troopers say the driver said he was tired and he collided with a culvert and rolled over. The driver, who was from Ft. Hood, was

taken to Advent Hospital in Killeen for “non-incapacitating” injuries, troopers say.

In 2019 in Texas, 377 people were killed in accidents involving distracted/drowsy driving. In the same year, Lampasas recorded 3 fatalities in the county due to distracted/drowsy driving, there were also 2 serious injuries, 31 non-injury accidents and 47 total accidents because of this.

In a recent study, it was found that 66% of fatal crashes are when drivers hit inanimate items, while 7.5% of drivers rear-ended other vehicles. In a AAA study, it was found that drivers who miss two to three hours of sleep a day more than quadruple their risk of getting in a crash, compared to drivers who sleep for seven hours.

Drowsy-driving crashes occur most frequently between midnight and 6 a.m., or in the late afternoon. At both times of the day, people experience dips in their circadian rhythm—the human body’s internal clock that regulates sleep. They often involve only a single driver (and no passengers) running off the road at a high rate of speed with no evidence of braking; and frequently occur on rural roads and highways.

To help you stay alert, drinking coffee or energy drinks alone is not always enough. They might help you feel more alert, but the effects last only a short time, and you might not be as alert as you think you are. If you drink coffee and are seriously sleep-deprived, you still may have “micro sleeps” or brief losses of consciousness that can last for four or five seconds. This means that at 55 miles per hour, you’ve traveled more than 100 yards down the road while asleep. That’s plenty of time to cause a crash. If you start to get sleepy while you’re driving, drink one to two cups of coffee and pull over for a short 20-minute nap in a safe place, such as a lighted, designated rest stop. This has been shown to increase alertness in scientific studies, but only for short time periods.

If you question if you are alert enough to drive, don’t! Stay home and get some sleep. It could make a huge difference.
