Homecoming Parade Today

Homecoming is returning this year with the Homecoming Parade today. The theme is "Badgers Assemble" with Marvel Superhero/villain themed floats. Line up will begin at 5:30pm today, the Judging will be at 6pm and the parade will kick off at 6:30 or as soon as the football boys can be there.

All riders must stay on the float until it is parked at the LCHEC parking lot and not exit the float at the stadium. There will be a pep rally immediately following the parade at Badger Stadium.

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on September 16th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 26 cases were brought to the court with 23 cases involving men, and 3 cases involving women. There were 4 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 2 cases for less than a gram, 1 case for 1-4 grams, and 1 case for 4-200 grams. There was one case of possession of a controlled substance PG2, 1-4 grams. There were 4 cases of tampering w/government records with the intent to defraud or harm, one case each for bail jumping/FTA, Theft of property, burglary and tampering with a witness in a family violence case.

In crimes involving personal harm, there were 3 cases of assault on a family member, two cases of injury to a child/sexual contact. There was one case each for sexual assault, aggravated assault w/ deadly weapon, violating a bond/protective order, and injury to a child/elderly/disabled person. In the interference w/child custody case, Kristine Whitehead requested a bond reduction and that was denied, bonds remain at \$110,000. There was one case each for assault/public servant, intoxication manslaughter and continuous violence against family.

Of the 26 cases 7 were resolved with Jacob Easter receiving 10 years TDCJ with 10 years probated plus court costs for violation of a bond/protective order/assault/stalking. Joshua Dartman of Florida pled guilty to the lesser charge of attempted sexual assault and was sentenced to 7 years deferred probation plus court costs of \$425. Joshua Dupree of Montana was sentenced to 2 years TDCJ probated for 5 years plus court costs and a fine for possession of a controlled substance PG1, less than a gram. on the charge of theft of property more than \$2500 w/ 2 or more previous convictions, Darrell Huffman of Killeen was sentenced to 15 months state jail after pleading guilty and the repeat offender notice was waived. Robert Wesley Morris II on the charges of assault/public servant, and manufacture/delivery of a controlled substance PG1 4-200 grams was sentenced to 30 years for each charge, with credit for days served. Blair Redd of Lampasas saw his charge of indecency with a child/sexual contact dismissed.

All other cases were rescheduled or set for jury trials.

Working from Home Still Popular with some

According to a story from IHeart media, some workers want to keep their work-from-home status so much they'll take a pay cut to keep it.

Remote working is popular for many reasons and Michael Cupps of ActiveOps gives us the biggest. "Getting in a car and driving, paying for parking and lunch. It's just the cost of working in an office that people didn't understand until they weren't spending it during the Covid Lockdown. It's a simple decision."

With skyrocketing inflation, many employers are giving across the board pay increases - and offering a remote work deal to forego the raise. Cupps says eventually it could be the norm. "The technology is catching up to make more and more jobs remote-friendly. But not all of them are going to be there!" People who make and fix things, plant and building things, serve you in some way and sell you items you want to see and feel before you buy.

Even with skyrocketing inflation - lots of workers are agreeing to a pay cut if they can just remain working remotely. Cupps points out that it's especially true with a certain demographic.

"Overwhelmingly, the 'younger generation' doesn't want to work in an office. I was with a client in Houston last week and he told me his daughter has been in the workforce for 3 years and has never set foot in her office!"

Cupps says it's not a bad deal for managers as multiple studies show remote some workers actually work more hours when not in the office
