The Badgers played a tough game against the Wimberley Texans on Badger field Friday, losing 38-28. David Flores was 15 out of 23 on the night with 143 yards, 2 touchdowns and an interception. Flores also had 2 rushing yards on 3 carries with 1 touchdown. Offensively, Owen Stubbs scored a 3 yard touchdown in the first quarter on a pass from Flores. Aden Rascoe had 10 carries for 53 yards, and also had 4 receptions for 27 yards and 1 touchdown. Carter Johnson had 3 receptions for 31 yards. Ethan Moreno carried the ball 15 times for 143 yards. Defensively, Reed Jerome had an interception in the second quarter, and Brock Langford also had an interception and a touchdown. Landon Richardson kicked 4 extra points as well as successfully executing an on-side kick that was recovered by Ryker Morua late into the fourth quarter. However, the drive didn't lead to any points for the badgers.


