The Weather



The High yesterday 79° The Low this morning 58°

The skies are already clearing, with a high expected in the upper 80's or low 90's. The southerly breezes are returning, and we'll see more sun, which means it will be warmer this weekend. Look for cooler weather next week, though, as a cold front moves through Central Texas beginning in the overnight hours on Sunday. There may be a shower or storm along the front. After the front passes through, the wind is expected to pick up, with sustained winds of 20-30 mph and higher gusts are possible. Overnight low temperatures are expected to be in the 50's with a few 40's possible in our area.

Tuesdays outlook shows NW winds sustained at 10-20 mph. Look for another round of cool air about mid-week keeping things cool.

Today Partly sunny with gradual clearing and a high near 88°. Wind will be from the S at 5-10 mph.

Tonight: Clear skies and a low near 63°, with E-SE wind at 5-10 mph.

Saturday: Sunny with a high temperature near 88° and a S wind at 5-10 mph.

Saturday night: Look for clear skies with a low near 68°. Winds will be S-SE at 5-10 mph.

Sunday: Sunny with a high near 90°. Winds will be S at 5-15 mph with possible gusts of 20 mph.

Sunday Night: Mostly clear and 66°. With a slight chance of storms early Monday morning. Winds will be S at 10-15 mph shifting west after midnight, with gusts as high as 20 mph.

Texas School Covid-19 Reports

The DSHS website for public school reporting was updated yesterday and today. The data is self reported by the schools, and is provisional and subject to change. Corrections may lead to data being updated with more accurate or complete information.

According to the website today, the number of students estimated on campus for the first week of school was 1,101,065. There have been 3,445 cumulative student cases, and 1,212 student cases reported for the week ending September 20th. There have been 2,850 cumulative cases among school staff, with 660 reported the week ending September 20th.

School districts with under 50 students case counts are suppressed in the interest of protecting personal information.

Computers Vulnerable at Election Time



Hamilton County, just to our north, was the victim of a malware attack, which sent fake email replies to voters and businesses who contacted officials in the Central Texas county.

This spotlights an overlooked vulnerability in smaller counties. According to the Texas Tribune and Propublica, last week, voters and election administrators who emailed Leanne Jackson, the clerk of Hamilton County, received bureaucratic-looking replies. "Re: official precinct results," one subject line read. The text supplied passwords for an attached file. But Jackson didn't send the messages. Instead, they came from Sri Lankan and Congolese email addresses, and they cleverly hid malicious software inside a Microsoft Word attachment. By the time Jackson learned about the forgery, it was too late. Hackers continued to fire off look-alike replies. Jackson's three-person office, already grappling with the coronavirus pandemic, ground to a near standstill.

The previously unreported attack on Hamilton illustrates the vulnerability of email systems in county offices that handle the voting process from registration to casting and counting ballots.

The Blotter



Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Thursday shows an early morning report of suspicious activity in the 800 block of N. Ridge St. at 12:43am. There was a minor accident in the 900 block of N. Key Ave. at 7:09am, which resulted in the arrest of Charlene Chirum, 63, of Liberty Hill for DWI w/ blood alcohol over 0.15 at 7:44am.

The afternoon shows a suspicious person in the 200 block of Northington St. at 1:43pm. There was a reported DWI in the 800 block of N. Key Ave at 2:43pm, and a shots fired call came in from the 1200 block of W. Ave A at 9:01pm.

Lampasas Sheriff's blotter for Thursday shows Lometa with a report of suspicious behavior and a structure fire. In Kempner officers tended to a reported fraud, animal issues, a suicidal person, medical calls, and a fish & game call. Out in the county there was an accident, a welfare check, animal/livestock issues, a reported fraud, and a medical call. Deputies went into Cove on a narcotics call, a house watch, an alarm call, a medical call, a reported disturbance, and reports of suspicious activity.

Officers also handled a stolen vehicle report out of San Saba.

The Lampasas Fire Dept. received a call about a structure fire on W. Main St. in Lometa. There were 2 buildings involved that were being used for storage. The buildings were a total loss.

The county-wide burn ban is lifted until September 28th at 5pm

Lampasas Radio spoke to the Lampasas County Elections office, and we were assured that no part of the voting process is online in Lampasas County.

Although the malware used against Hamilton likely originated with foreign hackers, said the Texas Tribune, it appears to have been part of a widespread campaign, rather than one that targeted election-related sites. The malware also doesn't appear to have spread from Hamilton to other Texas counties.

Still, such attacks could rattle voters' confidence — or, at worst, bring down systems on election day. The type of malware deployed against Hamilton, called Emotet, often serves as a delivery mechanism for later ransomware attacks in which swindlers commandeer a victim's computer and freeze its files until a ransom is paid.

Jackson, who has been county clerk less than a year, said she didn't know who in the office clicked on the fake messages. She also said she noticed what appeared to be phishing emails on Monday, Sept. 14, and first alerted BizProtec, the county's outside IT firm the next day. By that afternoon, BizProtec called to assure her that it had fixed the problem by changing computer passwords for her and the rest of the office, which Hamilton County employees cannot do on their own. But the new passwords didn't help. By noon this past Monday, a week after the attack began, her inbox had more than 35 suspicious emails — including one that appeared to be from the county judge and contained malware.
