The Weather



The High yesterday 85° The Low this morning 61°

Today looks to be a pretty day with a heat index in the upper 80's and low 90's. Tomorrow should be another warm one with southwesterly winds in Central Texas, and compressional heating bringing the temperatures tomorrow afternoon to the 90's before a strong cold front moves through overnight on Sunday, with storm chances along the front.

The weather story on Monday will be the winds which are expected to be 20-30 mph before decreasing Monday night.

Today: Sunny and a high of 87°. Wind will be from the S at 5-10 mph.

Tonight: Mostly clear with light S-SE winds, and a low near 69°.

Sunday: Mostly cloudy in the morning with gradual clearing and a high near 89°. Winds will be S at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Overnight Sunday it will get down to 63° with increasing clouds and a 20% chance of precipitation after midnight. Winds will be S at 10-15 mph and possible gusts as high as 20 mph.

Monday: Mostly sunny with a high near 74° and a blustery N wind at 20-25 mph gusting to 30 mph.

Monday Night: Mostly clear with a low near 52° and N winds at 15-20 mph.

Meetings Next Week



The Lampasas County Commissioners' Court has a regular meeting Monday at 9am in the District Courtroom.

The Agenda includes the consent agenda, accounts payable and payroll, adopting a budget and tax rate for fiscal year 2020-2021, RFP custodial services, election business, a resignation, the burn ban and some change orders for the new jail.

The Lampasas City Council will meet Monday evening for a workshop session at 5:30pm. Discussions will include the Chamber of Commerce 3rd quarter report, the Chamber of Commerce Tourism and Visitor Center Agreement, Covid updates, the City Council Work Plan, and amending the No Parking Zones for 281S.

Council will meet for a regular session at 6pm. The agenda for the regular meeting includes the consent agenda, the monthly investment report for August, a designation of fire prevention week (Oct. 4-10), the second readings of ordinances on the following; modification for a manufactured home overlay to an existing single family (SF-6) zoning at 1306 E. Ave H; a specific use permit in an area zoned commercial to allow for two-family residential duplexes on Mill St. between College and Briggs St.; a specific use permit in an area zoned commercial to allow for micro-blading and cosmetic tattooing at 1002 E. 4th St. The agenda also includes departmental reports, routine matters, and

mayor's comments. New business includes Chamber of Commerce business/Tourism & Visitor Center Agreement, amending the no parking zones on 281S, adopting a budget and tax rates. The Council may also go into executive session to evaluate financial information received from a business prospect and economic development negotiations, then return to regular session for action on items in the executive session.

Funeral Notice

Dorothy Smith Derwin, 102, of Lampasas, passed away on September 22nd.

Funeral Services will be held at 2 p.m. on Saturday, September 26, at First Street Church of Christ with a visitation an hour prior. Interment will be private.

Dorothy was born on October 24, 1917, in Lometa, Texas to Steven and Effie Smith.

Originally from Bell County, Dorothy's family moved to Lampasas County, where her father was a tailor. Her earliest childhood memories included her two half-brothers returning home from World War I, and gleefully throwing her up into the air. She graduated from Lometa High School and her first job was delivering groceries for the Lometa grocery store. This was remarkable since Dorothy did not know how to drive, and groceries were delivered by car! She would practice driving in the alleyways behind storefronts in Lometa. She would giggle telling this story and say she may have hit a few boxes during those lessons. Times were tough during the Great Depression, and she made \$ 1 a day.

After working three years in the grocery business, her boss recommended that she enroll at Jackson's Business School in Lampasas. With an impeccable business reputation, the Mayor loaned her the tuition money, and her father and brother co-signed the note. Renting a room in Lampasas, she began her business education in September, 1941. In February 1942, Dorothy quit business school after the death of her father and took a job as Secretary of County Welfare and later Secretary to the County School Superintendent. This boss later became the County Judge and continued to employ her along with adding an additional attorney, Geron Crumley who worked with Dorothy for many years. She didn't retire until she was 74.
