Wildfire Danger Increasing

Texas A&M Forest Service fire analysts warn of wildfire activity, including the potential for significant wildfires, through Friday in the Western Pineywoods, Southeast and Central Texas.

While Hurricane Ian makes landfall in Florida and the national wildland fire preparedness level has decreased to a 2, wildfire activity has steadily increased over the past two weeks in Texas.

As the lack of rainfall and high temperatures have dried surface vegetation, Texas A&M Forest Service firefighters have responded to 65 wildfires over the past week, whereas the agency responded to just six wildfires during the first week of the month.



"The 2022 fire season has been significant for the state of Texas, as state and local firefighters have responded to more than 9,800 wildfires," said Wes Moorehead, Texas A&M Forest Service Fire Chief. "The state received beneficial rainfall mid- to late-August, which helped to significantly slow the operational tempo for wildland firefighters. However, the benefits of that moisture have started to wane, and we are, once again, observing dry conditions across the state that is resulting in increased wildfire activity."

Very dry conditions following the weekend's cold front have resulted in accelerated drying of vegetation across large portions of the state this week.

Multiple days of relative humidity values below 25% will result in widespread critically to extremely dry surface fuel in the eastern half of the state by the end of the week. Wind speeds are forecast to increase to 10-15 mph out of the northeast and, when combined with dry vegetation, will support wildfire growth.

There is potential for significant wildfires where pine and yaupon fuels are present in the Western Pineywoods, Southeast and Central Texas. Historically, these high-risk fuels have produced high impact or significant wildfires that threaten public safety and property. Any ignitions that occur may also be resistant to firefighters' suppression efforts.

By the weekend, the Texas Panhandle may also experience increased wildfire activity in areas where cured grasses are present. Below normal rainfall amounts, low relative humidity and elevated wind speeds will support wildfire activity.

What to know about the Texas Drought

From the Texas Water Development Board: "Last month, Texas finally got some much-needed relief from an extremely hot and dry summer. In August, record-breaking rainfall significantly improved drought conditions in parts of the state. And more rain and below-normal temperatures are expected through at least the end of September. Despite lower temperatures and increased precipitation that have helped ease the drought, we haven't crossed the finish line just yet. The current drought situation didn't develop overnight.

The current Texas drought began in September 2021, spurred by a La Niña climate pattern that resulted in drier and hotter conditions across the southern United States, which persisted through the end of 2021 and ended with the hottest Texas December on record.

April through July 2022 was the hottest stretch on record for those months in Texas. In addition, triple-digit temperatures and below-normal rainfall over the last few months intensified drought conditions by drying out soils and increasing evaporation from water bodies and the landscape. (cont'd)

(cont'd from front) By early August, drought had intensified across most of Texas, covering a large swath from North Texas to South Texas. At that point, rainfall deficits in much of Central Texas and southeastern Texas were between 11 and 16 inches. During the 2010–2014 drought, there were weeks when drought impacted 100 percent of the state, and 2011 was the driest 12 consecutive months statewide on record.

How long will the current drought last? A return to average rainfall conditions in September and October could provide much-needed relief. And, while the current hurricane season has been quiet here in Texas, we could still see tropical activity through the end of November. But the La Niña climate pattern that has contributed to drier and hotter-than-average conditions since late 2021 is anticipated to continue into early 2023, suggesting that drought is likely to remain in many areas of the state."

Locally, the Drought Map shows parts of Coryell County to be in exceptional drought while Lampasas County is showing severe and extreme drought, with the exceptional drought being the highest classification of drought.
