The Weather



The High yesterday was 66° The Low this morning 40°

.21 in. of rain fell on Saturday at Lampasas Airport.

Today: Sunny, with a high near 59° and N-NW wind 10-15 mph with gusts to 20 mph.

Tonight: Mostly clear with a low around 29° and north wind 5-10 mph becoming calm.

Tuesday: Sunny, with a high near 66° and the calm wind will begin to shift and come from the south at 10-15 mph. Overnight it will drop to about 42° with 10-15 mph wind.

The rest of the Week: Wednesday will be a nice sunny day with a high around 71° expected. The southerly winds will continue and perhaps get a little gustier overnight and into Thursday. The Thursday high will be around 68° as another weak cold front arrives to drop Friday's high to the mid 50s. Saturday should top out in the low 60s – about the same on Sunday with lots of clouds.

Missing 4yr Old Found 1 1/2 Miles From Home

A 4yr old boy, evidently seeking some adventure, wandered away from home in the 2200 block of CR 3170 early last evening and was found by a neighbor about a mile and a half away. His mother, Jennifer Moos, 28, was happily reunited with her son a little over an hour from the time she discovered him missing.

According to a press release from the Sheriff's Office, Jennifer said she had laid down with her young son to take a nap and when she woke up about 20 minutes later, he was gone. She noticed a dining chair had been pushed against the screen door and it was unlatched. After she searched for him for about 20 minutes, she called the Sheriff's Dept. and reported him missing. She also posted the missing child report, with his picture, on Facebook. (We cropped it here for space)

Several deputies, a CID investigator, a game warden and the Kempner VFD joined in a search. They even called for a scent tracking dog from Austin.

Meanwhile, a neighbor called the Sheriff's Office and reported that he had been told by another neighbor that a small boy, with a puppy, had been walking down CR 4530. The neighbor, Nicolas Kramer located the child and puppy in front of his driveway and picked them up, then headed down the dirt road in search of the child's home. The child was not verbal so he couldn't figure out where the little guy lived and then returned to his own home.



He soon spotted a Lampasas County Deputy driving down the road. He flagged him down and released the boy, and his puppy to the Deputy.

So a relieved mother and her son were soon reunited. The little guy was in good condition, and even though his adventure only got about a mile and a half from home and lasted about an hour, it was something to remember for him, and quite a scare for his mother and the authorities.
