The Weather

The High yesterday was 64° The Low this morning 45° Wind gusts out of the south on Sunday were up to 25 mph. About 7pm it calmed and shifted as the new cold front came in with northerly 20 mph gusts.

Today: Sunny, with a high near 64° this afternoon and N-NW wind 5-15 mph.

Tonight: Clear, with a low around 39° and the north wind at 5 mph calms and shifts to southerly as the cold front passes on through.

Tuesday: Sunny, with a high near 66° and calm wind becoming light, out of the south, at 5-10 mph. Overnight the temperature will get down to the low 40s.

School is Back in Session!

Lampasas County Commissioners meet this

morning at 9am on the 1st floor of the courthouse. In addition to the usual consent agenda items, the court will discuss a proposal to repair the AC system at the Annex 1 building at 409 S. Pecan St, renewing the Secure tech Systems warranty program for a two year extension, appraisal district budget amendments and the jail project.

This afternoon, at 1pm, the court will meet again in the usual Department Head meeting in the County Office Building's Conference Room at 1:30pm. On that agenda are department head matters and more possible discussion of the jail project.

Lampasas City Council will meet at 5:30pm today for a workshop session and at 7pm for their regular session. Discussions and plans will be on the additional work to be done at the 580 Sports Park's Rodeo Arena and the remodeling of the Old City Hall build-



ing into a new City Council Chamber and meeting rooms. The discussions will also return on the proposed building of a Water/ Wastewater facility.

A big ticket item for over a million dollars will be discussed as the Coleman water line extension project and some pressure reducing valves appears ready to be awarded to contractor Nelson Lewis, Inc. That extension is part of a long term plan to create a water line loop around the city. There is also a move to award a bid of over \$420 thousand to M&C Fonseca Construction for the West Ave. E project.


