The Weather



The High yesterday was 65° The Low this morning 33°

Wind gusts out of the NW Monday were up to 20 mph.

Today: Sunny, with a high near 68° and calm wind becoming southerly again, between 5 and 10 mph.

Tonight: Clear, with a low around 43° and south wind between 5 and 10 mph.

Wednesday: Mostly sunny with a high near 72° and south wind 10-20 mph and gusting to 25 mph.

The rest of the Week: Thursday will bring sunshine and a high near 54°, along with a good deal of wind. The wind will be coming out of the SW at 10-15 mph at first, then shift to N-NW and go up to 15-20 mph and gusting up to 35 mph.

Thursday night will bring cold, dropping down to 30° by early morning with N-NW wind 15-20 and gusting to 25 mph.

Friday will be sunny with a high near 54° and the N-NW wind will drop to 5-10 mph and then calm before it shifts back to southerly. Overnight the temperature will drop to 31° after the wind shifts back to NW.

Saturday will be sunny but still cold with the N-NW wind 10-15 mph and gusting to 20. The high temperature will be about 47°. Saturday night will be very cold, dropping down to 25°.

Commissioners Spend on HVAC and Energy Audits

Lampasas County Commissioners met Monday morning at the courthouse and approved 4 agenda items, each with a 5-0 vote.

The meeting started off with a presentation from Johnson Controls for an energy audit for all county buildings. They offer guaranteed savings with upgrades to AC/heating and electrical to more efficient systems, thus avoiding any new funds allocation. Johnson will provide further details on the audit to the Commission.

The Sheriff's Department reported that they are ready to begin the bid process for the new jail, and it was noted by Commissioner Lindeman that the site now has an official address, 1210 Barnes Street.

A heat exchanger repair and A/C replacement for Courthouse Annex 1 was approved. The new A/C unit will be for the tax office and the Ag Extension office and will be installed by All Seasons Service.

A 2-year extension for an IT security warranty by Secure Tech Systems was approved.

2017 Appraisal District budget amendments were approved. No additional funds were requested.

The last item approved came from Accounts Payable for 3-year lease for a skid steer for Precinct 2.



Lampasas City Council Agrees to Big Ticket Items

The Council met in a workshop session on Monday evening, and discussed several of the larger expenditure items before the regular session.

City Manager, Finley deGraffenried, presented an update on the proposed renovation of the Old City Hall Building. Emphasis was made that this is a "remodel" project, and as such, there can always be unanticipated costs.

Total estimated costs as of Dec 31st, 2017 stood at \$1,037,568.

Requests for bids by way of a piece-bid process should start going out by Jan 22nd. The Council approved the proposal that the procurement process should go forward.

Chris Harrison of Harrison Construction, a former Council member, made a presentation for the improvement of lighting to the 580 Sports Complex Rodeo Arena and for the construction of a metal building, bleachers and an announcer's booth. This is a project with private funding where the procurement process and approval will be handled by The City of Lampasas.

The Council gave their approval, which included a commitment by the City to pave the road to the site.

Also addressed in the Workshop was the proposal for the Water/Wastewater Shop Lab and Offices to move (*Cont. on back*)

Badger Basketball teams up against Burnet tonight!

Lampasas traditional favorite rival. The two

teams are fairly well matched, but Lampasas sees Burnet as a team-to-beat for reasons besides the rivalry.

Lampasas wants in the playoffs! - and they need to get wins in order to rise above teams like Salado in their won-loss record in order to do that.

This year the Lady Badgers come into the Burnet game with a 2-2 district record, 15-13 overall. They were on a 7 game winning streak until last Friday's loss to Glenn. Lampasas has 2 seniors on the roster.

The Lady Bulldogs have a 3-1 district record and 13-12 overall. They beat Llano, Salado and Taylor, but lost to Liberty Hill. They have 4 seniors on the roster and they have won their last 4 games in a row.

The Lady Badgers JV will play at 5pm, the Varsity at 6:15pm and the JV at 7:30pm.

Badger Boys Varsity Basketball (17-6/1-1), will be much like the girls team this week, fighting to regain their winning ways, and fighting to win a friendly big rivalry game.

The Badgers 50-52 loss to Leander Glenn last week was a huge disappointment for the Badgers and that wound could easily be healed by a win over this year's powerful Burnet team.

Burnet now leads the district with its 3-0 record, though most rankers put Liberty Hill (2-0) at the top. Burnet hasn't played them yet.

Burnet nevertheless, is a really good team, so far winning over Taylor, Salado and Llano. They have 3 seniors on the team, and 4 players altogether, that were on the varsity roster last year.

This year's Lampasas team is senior rich with 5 returning varsity players from last year's district leading playoff team and a few good players that weren't on varsity last year.

Lampasas is currently number 4 in the district standings with its 1-1 record and will be after the win tonight.

The JV teams will play at 5pm this evening, the freshmen at 6:15pm and the Varsity at 7:30pm.

On Friday, Badger teams will travel to Liberty Hill.

Soccer Play this week:

This week the Varsity and JV Boys will be at Killeen Shoemaker for a games today with the JV playing at 5pm and Varsity at 7pm.. After that game the Varsity team will travel to Austin Burger for a tournament on Thursday where they'll meet San Marcos at 7pm. On Friday that tournament has them up against Seguin at noon and Elgin at 6pm.
