## The Weather

The forecast front is moving a little slower than expected, but moved through this morning. The winds will shift to the NE with this front, and look for high temperatures in the 80's. After another cool morning, nice weather is in store for Friday with high temperatures mostly in the 70's. Lows should dip into the 50's on Friday night. **The City of Lampasas** Police Chief **Sammy** Bailey and Assistant Chief Jody Cummings visited the Lampasas Radio Studios this morning.

The Chief and Assistant Chief were talking about the National Night Out program. While it used to be a time for residents to get out and meet the Law Enforcement Officers, and First Responders, due to Covid, the event at the HEB parking lot will not take place. It was explained that the event at HEB began because there are so many rural areas in the county, and this was a central place to meet and get to know the law enforcement officers. This year LPD had to think outside the box due to the challenges presented. So they are asking residents to decorate their yards and front porches to promote crime prevention and the Badgers. (Blue light bulbs seem popular).



There will be a selection of judges that will drive around and judge the yards/houses/porches on National Night Out, October 6<sup>th</sup>, and the trophies (pic below) will be presented October 7<sup>th</sup>. Chief Bailey also encourages residents to create Neighborhood Watches, and there is a website to assist in creating a group. Lampasas has 21 patrol officers, who take precautions in many ways, wearing masks, social distancing, and on the administrative end, she stated that in some instances warrants are issued for people to turn themselves in.

The PD gains some arrests on traffic stops, and some on suspicious activity calls, like the one last week where 100 lbs. of marijuana was discovered. Chief Bailey stresses that if you see something, say something, and when you are in Texas, you have to follow Texas laws.

Lampasas Radio does not have an updated number of cases for today. Yesterday we had 25 active cases. The State of Texas reported 5,335 new cases yesterday, with 3,344 Texans hospitalized for coronavirus.



The TEA has updated their website for school reporting. For the week ending Sunday, September 27<sup>th</sup>, Lampasas ISD had 8 new cases in grades 7-12, and 1 new staff case. Starting with the week ending September 20, Lampasas has had a total of 2 cases in students under 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, 13 cases in grades 7-12, and 6 total staff cases. 4 of the cases were contracted off –campus, and 17 are unknown.




