The Weather

Thursday Night: Mostly cloudy skies with a low near 67° and light winds become SE in the night. There is a 60% chance of showers and storms.

Fatal Accident on 281

On October 1st, at approximately 10:22pm, Texas DPS Troopers responded to a major crash on US 281 8.1 miles south of the City of Evant. Investigating Troopers stated that a 2020 Ford Edge sedan, operated by a 48 year-old male from Austin, Texas, was travelling northbound on US 281. A 2016 Dodge Ram pick-up truck, operated by a 71 year-old male from San Antonio, Texas, was southbound approaching the Ford. The investigation revealed that the Ford sedan crossed over the double yellow center stripe and crossed into the path of the Dodge. The driver of the Dodge Ram attempted to take evasive action and swerve to avoid a collision. The Ford collided head on with the Dodge truck.

The passenger in the front right seat of the Dodge, identified as 62 year-old Carol Ann Neatherlin of San Antonio, Texas, was pronounced deceased on scene by Justice of the Peace Cameron Brister. The driver of the Dodge was transported to Rollins Brook Hospital in Lampasas for non-life threatening injuries. The driver of the Ford, Jeffrey Lederer, showed signs of intoxication and was charged with intoxication manslaughter. The crash investigation is still active and open. District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on October 1st. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 43 cases were brought to the court with 34 cases involving men, and 9 cases involving women. Christopher Henderson of Copperas Cove failed to appear on the charge of DWI 3rd or more.

Ashlee Knowles failed to appear on two charges of possession of a controlled substance PG1. Angelica Gonzalez failed to appear on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram.

There were 15 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 8 cases for less than a gram, 6 cases for 1-4 grams, and 1 case for 4-200 grams. There were also 2 cases for possession of a controlled substance/PG2 less than a gram. There were 4 DWI cases.

There were 4 cases for engaging in organized criminal activity, and one case each for theft, bail jumping, evading arrest w/vehicle, prohibited substance in a correctional facility, tampering w/evidence and harassment of a public servant.

There were 3 cases for assault on a family member, and 3 cases for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon. There were 2 cases for aggravated sexual assault of a child, and indecency with a child by sexual contact. There was one case of injury to a child/elderly person and 1 case of aggravated assault/public servant.

Of the 43 cases, 3 were settled with Antonia Felan of Gatesville pleading guilty to possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram and received 3 years probation plus fines and costs. Cynthia Valdez, of Harker Heights plead guilty to engaging in organized criminal activity and was sentenced to 5 years probation plus fines and costs. Shamik Davis of Copperas Cove saw the charge of injury to a child/elderly person dismissed.

The rest of the cases were reset or had dates set for jury trials.

Coronavirus Update

Statewide, according to the DSHS, there were 2,385 new and 566 probable new cases on October 4th, along with 53 deaths. There were also 7,934 Texans in the hospital with Covid-19. Locally, the DSHS dashboard for cases shows 0 new confirmed cases in Lampasas County on October 4th, and 95 confirmed cases in the last 14 days. The state estimates Lampasas County to have 186 active cases at this time.
