# The Weather

#### The High yesterday $86^{\circ}$ The Low this morning $60^{\circ}$

The forecasters say we should remain sunny and warm in our area. Sunday may be hot and windy with temperatures reaching into the 90's and locales west of 281 may reach triple digits.

These conditions may lead to elevated grass fire conditions to our north. After a warm day on Monday, a cool front is expected to move through, though the forecasters are not sure how much of a cool down it will bring. The forecast high temperatures early next week range from  $75^{\circ}$ - $85^{\circ}$ .

# **City Manager Notes**

Lampasas City Manger Finley de Graffenried was in Lampasas Radio studios this morning for his weekly visit with Ronnie Witcher.

The City Manager spoke about the upcoming City Council Meeting on October 12<sup>th</sup>, and said it looks like a light agenda. He reminded residents that the brush chipping program begins November 2<sup>nd</sup> and to look at the city webpage or

call the city to find out when your area will be served. The City Council decides where the capital expenditures (large projects) are completed. As Mr. de Graffenreid stated "the budget is a roadmap for the staff and the town". The plans are to finish up the W. Ave E project, and do some sewer line updates/ upgrades on W. Ave C. Early in the spring the City will begin taking bids for East 3<sup>rd</sup> St. to include some sidewalk upgrades, the road, and curb and gutter. Also, the City is looking to replace some equipment such as the street sweeper and the vacuum truck. Ronnie Witcher asked about the expense for new utility poles with the upgraded internet possibilities in the near future. It was explained that in 2014 & 2015 a company was brought in to assess the utility poles in the city and with the exception of a few poles, they have been upgraded or replaced. Developers can provide underground utilities for new subdivisions if they choose, at their expense. This may become more popular in the city. Ronnie Witcher and Mr. de Graffenreid spoke about possible employers coming to the city, and that the city needs a viable, well trained workforce to accommodate employers. The City Manager spoke about possible employees being trained in the "soft skill" training, people skills communication, and the like. Ft. Hood is also a possible resource for future employees.

# **District Court Notes**



**Lampasas County Courthouse** was the site of a 27<sup>th</sup> District Court Docket Call on October 2nd. Presiding over the Court was 27<sup>th</sup> District Court Judge John Gauntt.

Altogether 36 cases were brought to the court, 27 of them involved men and 9 involved women. Joshua D. Sanchez of Lampasas failed to appear on the charges of injury to a child/bodily injury, and possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram. A warrant was issued for his arrest. Bond was found insufficient for Dean Mitchell for evading arrest w/ a vehicle and a warrant was issued.

There were 15 cases involving possession of a controlled substance PG1; 9 for under 1 gram, 3 for 1-4 grams, and 1 for 4-200 grams. There was also one case for manufacture/delivery of a controlled substance and one case for possession of a controlled substance PG2 less than a gram

There was one case each for theft \$2500-\$30000, possession of a firearm by a felon, credit and debit card abuse, unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, and one burglary of a building case. There were 2 cases for engaging in organized criminal activity.

Crimes causing personal harm included one for continuous violence against family, one for arson, one for stalking, two cases for abandoning/endangering a child/criminal negligence, three for injury to a child/elderly person, and 4 for evading arrest. There were 3 cases for indecency with a child/sexual contact.

Of the 36 cases presented to the court, nine cases were settled. For possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram, Ryan Keith plead guilty and received 3 years probation plus costs; Rene Garza plead guilty and received 4 years probation w/ the sanction of MHMR treatment plus costs; and Fabricio Bienbenu had a guilty plea and was sentenced to 2 years probation plus costs. John Bryan West saw his probation extended for 2 years w/ no new sanctions for manufacture/delivery of a controlled substance/ possession PG1 4-200 grams; John West also plead guilty to credit/debit card abuse and received 5 years probation plus costs. Damon Richers-Keiffer on two counts, one for unauthorized use of a vehicle for which he received 14 months state jail, and one for evading arrest for which he received 3 years TDCJ.


