The forecasters tell us this will be a hot weekend, with a front on Monday bringing us back to seasonal temperatures.

Today: Partly sunny, then clearing and a high of 92°. Wind will be light from the S.

Tonight: Mostly clear with light S-SE winds becoming calm, and a low near 65°.

After a 2-week hiatus, the Badgers saw a big win against the Taylor Ducks, 59-0. The Amazing Badgers

are now 4-0/1-0.

The Badgers put 42 points on the board by halftime, and had 17 additional points in the 2nd half. The Badgers had 5 passing and 3

rushing touchdowns plus 11 kicking points. The Lampasas team had 337 total yards in the 1st half, and 130 in the 2nd half for a total of 467 yards. (222 rushing and 245 receiving.)

Badger Quarterback Ace Whitehead completed 15 of 16 passes for 245 yards and 5 touchdowns. Michael Murray had 5 receptions for 74 yards and 2 touchdowns. Lane Haviland had 4 receptions for 98 yards and 2 touchdowns, and Ethan Moreno had 5 receptions for 62 yards and 1 touchdown.

Ace Whitehead led the rushing with 5 carries, 74 yards and 1 touchdown. Joseph Whitehead had 9 carries for 57 yards rushing and Jack Jerome had 14 carries for 55 yards and 2 touchdowns. Next Friday the Badgers(4-0/1-0) have the 281 rivalry with the Burnet Bulldogs (4-2/1-0). Burnet beat district opponent Fredericksburg 21-6 last night, gaining all of their points in the 2nd half. It should be a good match-up.



"Thank you to our federal partners at FEMA for their continued support throughout the pandemic and for providing this crucial funding for our state's crisis counseling services."

"People throughout Texas experiencing mental or emotional stress associated with the COVID-19 pandemic can get the support they need with the help of this federal funding," said Sonja Gaines, HHS deputy executive commissioner for Intellectual and Developmental Disability & Behavioral Health Services. "This grant allows Texas families to have greater access to the services they need during this challenging time."

This grant is in addition to the \$5.8 million in FEMA crisis

This grant is in addition to the \$5.8 million in FEMA crisis counseling funds health officials announced in May and will extend counseling services to 28 local mental health and behavioral health authorities in Texas. The grant is expected to connect an additional 240,000 Texans throughout the state to short-term crisis counseling services.

The funding will also continue the COVID-19 Mental Health Support Line and support various organizations that focus on emergency management, public health, social services and crisis counseling in emergency shelters. Individuals struggling with substance use issues will also benefit from the disaster crisis counseling services;
