City Council

A city council meeting was held on Monday evening to discuss the operational report, tree-trimming services, light and decorative installation, and other topics. The operational report shows that Airport planning is reaching a 'contracting phase' as TxDOT directs funds towards to the project. Steady progress is being made on the skate park as compaction passed inspection, the city is hopeful the pad will be completed in the next two weeks. A motion to renew annual tree-trimming services with McCoy Tree Service was passed. Additionally, a motion to approve installation and removal of Christmas lights at WM Brook Park was passed.

Last Day to Register to Vote

Today is the deadline in Texas to register to vote to be able to participate in the 2022 midterm elections, where voters will cast their ballots on everything from the gubernatorial race between Gov. Greg Abbott and Beto O'Rourke to local races for county judge and state representative.

Texas is one of a handful of states with a voter registration deadline 30 days before the election. Here's what you need to know about checking your status and registering to vote before the end of day Tuesday.

You can check to see if you're registered and verify your information on the Texas secretary of state's website.

You'll need one of the following three combinations to log in:

- 1) Your Texas driver's license number and date of birth.
- 2) Your first and last names, date of birth and county you reside in.
- 3) Your date of birth and Voter Unique Identifier number, which appears on your voter registration certificate.

Who can register to vote in Texas?

U.S. citizens in Texas can register to vote in the election if they are 18 or older or if they will be 18 by Election Day, which is Nov. 8.

TxDOT Project Beginning

LAMPASAS COUNTY – Friday, Oct. 14, barricades will be set in preparation of a preventative maintenance project that includes the installation of passing lane and safety improvements on US 190 in Lampasas County.

The Texas Department of Transportation's (TxDOT) contractor, Big Creek Construction, LTD., will begin the first phase of construction on Mon., Oct. 17. Limits of the project will extend from the San Saba County Line to US 183.

Crews will begin with brush clearing and concrete work in the right of way, installing safety end treatments to culverts. Shoulder closures will occur with occasional lane closures as concrete trucks make deliveries.

Motorists are asked to use caution when driving in this area, avoid distractions, and watch for equipment and crews entering/exiting the roadway.

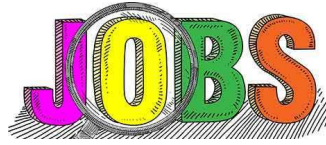

EPA's Plan Addresses Climate Change

The Environmental Protection Agency said last week that it will roll out a suite of new actions and communication strategies to help Texans adapt to the impacts of climate change — particularly flooding, severe storms and drought.

The plan for EPA's Region 6 — which includes Texas, Arkansas, Oklahoma, New Mexico and Louisiana — found that Texas' largest vulnerabilities to climate change are to the impacts of more severe droughts, sea level rise, more intense coastal flooding and increased intensity of storms — particularly stronger hurricanes, longer-lasting heat waves and extreme rainstorms.

EPA officials will take several proactive actions, including increasing inspections at industrial facilities along the Gulf Coast that are vulnerable to hurricanes; incorporating climate change adaptation measures into environmental permitting; and increasing enforcement on water systems that fail to comply with federal rules.

The EPA strategy, the agency's first update to the plans since 2014, includes the expansion or creation of several outreach and communication programs to educate neighborhoods disproportionately impacted by the effects of climate change on steps they can take to better prepare. For example, the federal agency will increase outreach to Gulf Coast communities susceptible to flooding.

Climate change brings with it more intense rainfall, heat, drought and flooding. As a result, more problems surface for cities and states. Water shortages affect everything from water quality in cities to crop failures for the state's agricultural sector to the demand for electricity. Without sufficient quantities of water, power companies can't cool their plants and customers could experience interruptions in service. Texans experienced that exact phenomenon in the summer of 2011, in the midst of an extreme drought.

And as climate change continues to increase average temperatures in Texas, the heat sucks out soil moisture and increases precipitation rates, exacerbating the impacts of such droughts. Texas is more vulnerable to water shortages because of rapid population growth in urban areas that is expected to dramatically increase the demand for limited water supplies.

Higher nighttime temperatures brought by climate change also exacerbate health impacts from ozone pollution, and several metropolitan areas in Texas are already failing on federal air quality standards.

PA Administrator Michael Regan said in a statement the climate adaptation plans mark "significant progress" for the EPA's efforts to protect human health and the environment as climate change increases the strain on the nation's infrastructure and communities.
