## The Weather

## **Commissioners Court**

A Commissioners Court meeting was held on Monday to discuss the county burn ban, holidays for 2023, and commissioner court meeting dates, among other agenda items. A proposal to extend the county burn ban that expires on October 23, 2022 was discussed to provide new restrictions and revise previous provisions found in the ban. Under the current burn ban, the usage and sale of fireworks is allowed. The new ban will prohibit this. Commissioner Jamie Smart expressed concerns that firework vendors in the county could end up with a "bad deal" as a firework ban going into effect could be a detriment to this line of work. The motion was tabled to have further discussion with citizens and firework vendors. A motion to approve the 2023 holiday-calendar was presented briefly before being tabled for further discussion. Discussion to add Juneteenth to the calendar was brought up after Commissioner Bobby Carrol expressed support for a 15 holiday-calendar similar to the 2020 holiday-calendar. A motion to increase the wage of election workers was approved. The current wage is \$9 and will be considered for an increase to \$10/\$11. This is still lower than the state wide average of \$13/\$15. A motion to recognize the commissioner court meeting dates for 2023 was approved.

## **District Court Notes**

**Lampasas County Courthouse** was the site of a 27<sup>th</sup> District Court Docket Call on October 7th. Presiding over the Court was 27<sup>th</sup> District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 37 cases were brought to the court with 24 cases involving men, and 13 cases involving women.

Vanessa Sanchez of Lampasas failed to appear on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram, and Patrick Lee failed to appear on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 1-4 grams.

There were 19 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 13 cases for less than a gram, 5 cases for 1-4 grams and one case for possession of 4-200 grams. There were 2 DWI cases.

There were 3 burglary cases, and one case each for fraud, theft of service, theft, evading arrest and engaging in organized criminal activity.

In crimes involving personal harm, there were 3 cases of assault on a family member, and two cases for assault on a public servant. There was one case each for abandoning/endangering a child, stalking and intoxication assault.

Of the 37 cases 8 were resolved with Allen Smith of Del Valle receiving 12 months in state jail for fraud/use of identifying info, less than 5 items. Patrick Ray was found guilty of assault on a public servant and was sentenced to 2 years TDCJ with credit for days served. Branden Tengler of Kempner saw his charge of burglary of a building dismissed, and pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance PG 1, 1-4 grams. He was sentenced to 10 years TDCJ with 10 years probated and with the stipulation of SAFPF, plus fines and court costs. Raymond Malone was sentenced to 5 years TDCJ with credit for days served on the charge of theft of service \$30,000 to \$150,000. Danyal Pierce pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram and was sentenced to 4 years probation plus court costs. John McBeth of Kempner pled guilty to DWI 3<sup>rd</sup> or more and was sentenced to 6 years in TDCJ with credit for time served plus court costs. Ulyses Rodriguez of Lampasas pled guilty to burglary of a habitation and was sentenced to 5 years TDCJ with credit for time served plus court costs.

All other cases were rescheduled or set for jury trials.

## **Beto's Fundraising Going Well**

(Texas Tribune) Democratic gubernatorial challenger Beto O'Rourke raised over \$25 million from July through late September, and Republican incumbent Greg Abbott raised just less than that, according to figures released Tuesday by both campaigns.

It marked the second consecutive period in which O'Rourke outraised Abbott. O'Rourke's campaign said he collected \$25.18 million during the latest period, covering July 1 through Sept. 29, while Abbott's campaign said he got nearly \$25 million.

Neither campaign released its latest cash-on-hand figures. Abbott had a nearly 2-to-1 advantage in cash at the end of June, with \$45.7 million saved up to \$23.9 million for O'Rourke.

(cont'd from front) The campaigns announced their latest fundraising numbers Tuesday ahead of an end-of-the-day deadline to report them to the Texas Ethics Commission.

O'Rourke's haul proved again why he is a formidable challenger to Abbott, even as the governor continues to lead in polling. O'Rourke raised \$27.6 million during the previous period, not only outraising Abbott by \$2.7 million but also setting a new record for fundraising in state-level politics.

O'Rourke's campaign said his latest haul came from almost half a million contributions, and the average contribution size was \$53. Nearly all of his 474,876 donations — 98% — were received online.

Abbott's campaign said his summer fundraising came from "nearly 45,000 contributors, and 81% of all the money came from within Texas."

With less than a month to the election, both campaigns are in heavy spending mode, dumping millions of dollars on TV ads statewide.

## **TxDOT Project Beginning**

LAMPASAS COUNTY – Friday, Oct. 14, barricades will be set in preparation of a preventative maintenance project that includes the installation of passing lane and safety improvements on US 190 in Lampasas County.

The Texas Department of Transportation's (TxDOT) contractor, Big Creek Construction, LTD., will begin the first phase of construction on Mon., Oct. 17. Limits of the project will extend from the San Saba County Line to US 183.

Crews will begin with brush clearing and concrete work in the right of way, installing safety end treatments to culverts. Shoulder closures will occur with occasional lane closures as concrete trucks make deliveries.

Motorists are asked to use caution when driving in this area, avoid distractions, and watch for equipment and crews entering/exiting the roadway.
