The Weather



The High yesterday 80° The Low this morning 51°

The forecasters say to look for mostly sunny skies with highs in the 80's gradually warming through today and tomorrow. Tomorrow will be 12-18 degrees above average, with gusty south winds. A cold front is expected to move through the area on Thursday accompanied by cooler temperatures and gusty north winds. The front is expected to bring a sharp wind shift from the north, increasing the winds to 20-25 mph with gusts possible of 35 mph for a few hours.

Today: Sunny with a high near 83°, with light E-SE breezes.

Tonight: Mostly clear skies with a low near 59° and winds becoming calm.

Wednesday: Skies will be sunny with a high near 92°, and wind will be S-SW at 5-10 mph.

Wednesday Night: Mostly clear skies with a low near 67°. Winds will be from the S at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Thursday: Sunny with a high near 85°, and gusty S-SW winds at 10-20 mph shifting to the N in the afternoon. Winds gusts of 30 mph are possible.

Thursday Night: Partly cloudy with a low near 51°. Winds will be brisk from the N-NE at 15-20 mph, gusting to 30 mph.

Early Voting Begins

Early Voting for the November 3rd general election begins today. Early Voting by personal appearance will be conducted each weekday at Lampasas County Annex One, Conference Room, 409 S. Pecan, Lampasas, TX, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. beginning on October 13, 2020 and ending on October 30, 2020. Additional early voting will be held at the same location as follows: October 20, 2020 and October 27, 2020 from 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. This is the only location for early voting in Lampasas County.

Voters should bring either (1) Texas Driver License issued by



the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS); 2. Texas Personal Identification Card issued by DPS; 3. Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS; 4. Texas Handgun License issued by DPS; 5. United States Military Identification Card containing the person's photograph; 6. United States Citizenship Certificate containing the person's photograph; 7. United States Passport (book or card).

The Texas Secretary of State specifies that voters ages 18-69 must present an acceptable photo ID. The ID presented may be expired for up to four years and still be valid. For those 70 or older, the acceptable form of photo ID may be expired for however long if the ID is otherwise valid.

Mail-in ballots are available if you meet at least one of the four eligibility requirements listed below: 1. 65 years of age or older 2. Sick or disabled 3. Expected Absence from the County* (Must be absent during the entire early voting period, Election Day, AND provide an out-of-county address where your ballot can be mailed, AND include dates you can receive mail at the out-of-county address.) 4. Confined in jail, but otherwise eligible to vote.

If you request a mail-in ballot, they are mailed within seven calendar days after the application is received, or the date the ballots become available for mailing, whichever is later. Our first batch of ballots for the November 3rd 2020 election will be mailed out by the end of September at the latest.

City Council



The Lampasas City Council met yesterday evening for regularly called meetings. During the workshop session, Council discussed updates on Covid-19, the Wings of Eagles skate park and a pavilion in Campbell park for public use. Fundraising is now taking place for these projects. Also discussed was regulating pedestrian crossing of 281S, and LPD Chief of Police Sammy Bailey requested an ordinance to be created for this situation.

Council's Regular Session covered a request to vacate a public right-of-way by E. 9th St. and Spring Ho Ave, then a second discussion for approval to combine lots 1-7 with the .085 acres previously discussed. The Consent Agenda was approved, then the City Manager gave his operational report touching on the subjects of increasing the bandwidth to meet the growing technological needs for the city. Mr. de Graffenreid also brought up the subject of contractors from outside the city and their purpose for being here, as well as the possibility of Council providing a drive-in movie in cooperation with a youth group.

Council then approved the vacating of the right-of-way and the combination of lots in the AH Barnes addition. Also approved was the ordinance request of Sammy Bailey to prevent pedestrians from crossing 281S from the light at EE Ohnmeiss to the County Line. Council also approved the re-appointment of several board members.

Coronavirus Update



The State of Texas reported 2,384 new cases yesterday, and 3,870 Texans were hospitalized for Covid-19. Locally, Dr. Hay shared this morning that there are now 39 active cases with 1 person in the hospital.

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on October 9th.

Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt.

Altogether 10 cases were brought to the court, 6 of them involved men and 4 involved women

There were 2 cases involving possession of a controlled substance PG1; 1 for under 1 gram, and 1 for 4-200 grams. There was also one case for DWI 3rd or more. There was one case for criminal mischief \$2500-\$30000. There was 1 case for engaging in organized criminal activity.

Crimes causing personal harm included one case each for abandoning/endangering a child/criminal negligence, accident involving injury, one for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon and one for invasive visual recording. There was one case for evading arrest w/vehicle.

Of the 10 cases presented to the court, five cases were settled. For possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram, Mindy Evans of Mullin plead guilty and received 3 years probation plus costs. On the charge of evading arrest w/vehicle, Christopher Sanchez saw the charges reduced to evading arrest, a class A misdemeanor and sentenced to 2 days in county jail with credit for 2 days plus costs. Ezequiel Cintron, on a charge of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon saw his charge reduced to assault causing bodily injury, a class A misdemeanor and sentenced to 60 days in county jail plus costs. Dwayne Walker on the charge of criminal mischief \$2500-\$30000 had an order barring prosecution, and on the charge of DWI 3rd or more he was sentenced to 4 years TDCJ probated plus costs.

The remainder of the cases were reset or had trials set for a future date
