The Weather

Sales Tax Rebates

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced last week he will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts 1.06 Billion dollars in local sales tax allocations for September. These allocations are based on sales made in August by businesses. In our area, Evant in Hamilton County saw their rebate increase 45.20% over the same period last year, with a \$6246.79 rebate. The City of Hamilton saw a 19.49% increase over the same period last year in their rebate check of \$71,465.34.

In Lampasas County, Lampasas shows their rebate is up 14.29% in their check of \$250,851.55. Lometa shows an increase of 13.19% with a rebate check for \$9,044.44 and Kempner received a rebate for \$12,767.01, a 22.52% increase from last year.

Holiday Shopping

Shoppers may be in for an onslaught of holiday discounts, according to a new online-shopping forecast from Adobe Analytics. The firm collected data from about 1 trillion online retail transactions to help predict sales patterns for November 1 to December 31, 2022. The report found that categories like electronics, toys, and computers are slated for major price cuts. Retailers will also attempt to entice inflation-weary shoppers with early discounts, such as Amazon's second Prime Day, on October 11 and 12.

According to Adobe, some of the price cuts could hit record highs of 32% and above, especially for gift items like electronics, toys, and computers. The firm also predicted that consumers will see a drop in cost for televisions, apparel, appliances, and sporting goods.

According to the report, the majority of the deals are expected to fall between Thanksgiving and Cyber Monday on Nov. 28.

Pain at the Pump

Major oil-producing countries, including Saudi Arabia and Russia have announced that they are cutting oil production by 2 million barrels a day. However, the impact on gas prices depends on which part of the country where you live.

Patrick De Haan, Head of Petroleum Analysis at Gas Buddy (an app that helps drivers find low fuel prices), shared that places like the Great Lakes Region and California are seeing rising prices at the pump. This is due to refinery issues in those areas. Gas prices in California have risen by \$1-\$1.50 a gallon, and in the Great Lakes area gas prices have gone up \$.50-\$1.00 per gallon. However, the national average should be \$.10-\$.30 higher due to the Opec decision to cut oil production. Due to the lack of production, oil prices are now \$15 per barrel higher than last week. He shared that the totality of the average impact would be 0.10 to 0.30 cents a gallon, once refinery issues are handled.

Refineries usually maintain their equipment in the off-peak times of the year, and with summer ending, several refineries are having seasonal maintenance done. (cont'd on back)

The Blotter

(cont'd from front) In California and the Great Lakes, the unexpected issues have not been major, but add them all together and it limits the refineries ability to produce gasoline. There are 4 refineries offline in California and this is causing prices to go up in that area. De Haan stated that after the refinery issues have improved, prices in these areas will drop, just not a much due to the OPEC decision.

Gasoline prices are rising, and more people are opting to stay at home than in the summer. Patrick also shared that by the end of the year, we could see prices lower than where we are today.
