The Weather

The warm start to the day and humidity means temperatures could soar in the 80's. Isolated storms may be possible this evening on overnight as the cold front heads our way. However, the wind shift associated with the cold front will not be felt until Tuesday afternoon.

Columbus Day: Mostly cloudy with a high near 81°, and winds will be S near 5 mph. There is a 30% chance of precipitation early this afternoon, tapering off after 4pm.

Tonight: A 30% chance of showers and storms after 7pm, with cloudy skies and a low near 71°. Light ESE winds near 5 mph becoming S after midnight.

Tuesday: Mostly cloudy with a high near 87°, and W wind at 5-10 mph. There is a 50% chance of showers and storms.

Tuesday night: Winds will be W at 5-15 mph, shifting to the N after midnight, and could gust to 20 mph. Otherwise, mostly cloudy with a low near 56 and a 50% chance of showers and storms. r
