The forecasters say we should see clearing through the morning and expect mostly sunny skies through this evening. The wind will gradually shift east and weaken. Tonight will be cool with our area in the upper 40's to low 50's. Look for more seasonable temperatures next week as a warming trend is expected.

Today: Gradual clearing then sunny and a high near 72°. Wind will be NE at 10-15 mph, gusting to 20 mph.

Tonight: Look for increasing clouds and a low near 50°, with wind becoming light and variable.

Saturday: Cloudy with gradual clearing and a high temperature near 79°. Winds will be from the S increasing to 10-15 mph in the afternoon with possible gusts of 25 mph.

The Bulldogs are very strong in the 3rd & 4th quarters.

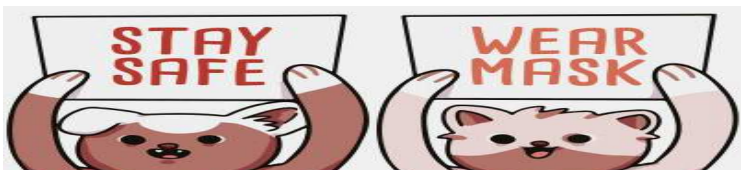

The Blotter



Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Thursday shows a burglary of a habitation reported at 6:22am in the 300 block of N. Park St. The 8 o'clock hour saw 2 arrests as 21 year old Samuel Rodriguez of Lampasas was arrested in the 500 block of E. Ave F at 8:29am for criminal trespass of a habitation, possession of dangerous drugs, and possession of marijuana less than 2 oz. in a drug free zone. Also arrested at that time and location was 19 year old Maximus Rodriguez of Waco for criminal trespass of a habitation. The afternoon shows a missing person reported in the 300 block of E. 4th St. at 12:55pm. A major accident took place at the intersection of W. 6th and Ridge St. at 4:55pm with one person injured.

Lampasas Sheriff's blotter for Thursday shows Lometa with a welfare check. In Kempner, officers dealt with reports of suspicious activity, livestock/animal issues, reported disturbances, a reported criminal mischief, a noise complaint and a request for extra patrol. Out in the county there were livestock/animal issues, and a medical call. Deputies went into Cove on a report of suspicious behavior and a medical call.

The website if txdpsscheduler.com. Car registrations are also exempt, in that you will not receive a citation for expired registration or license at this time.

Sgt. Washko also shared that October is National School Bus Safety Month, and National School Bus Safety week is next week October 19-23. He reminds us that school buses carry precious cargo, and that children are 70 times safer on a bus than in a car. Troopers at times will ride on buses that have issues with cars passing them, with a follow car assisting. Vehicles have to stop for a school bus with the exception of a grass or concrete median separating the directional lanes. A ticket for passing a school bus with lights flashing/stop sign out is \$1250-\$2000.

Coronavirus Update



Dr. Hay reached out to Lampasas Radio this morning and Lampasas County is up to 385 cases with 31 active. The State of Texas reported 4,615 new cases and 4,263 Texans are hospitalized for the Coronavirus. The Lampasas ISD website shows an additional active case for Lampasas High School for a total of 4 active/16 recovered students, and shows 0 active/recovered staff.

Early Voting

Lampasas County Elections Office shared that 783 residents voted in person yesterday for a total of 2330 in-person voters. The Elections office has received 454 ballots by mail for a total of 2784 ballots.

In Our Studios

Sgt. Bryan Washko (right) of Texas DPS was in our studios Thursday morning for his regular 'Trooper Talk'. He and Ken Gontarek, our morning DJ covered a variety of subjects.

They spoke of how DPS is handling the Covid crisis, and Sgt. Washko shared that DPS tests every employee once a month. All 7000 of them. He is responsible for coordinating those tests, and shared that there has not been a high number of positive cases and most of those are asymptomatic. Most DPS troopers are alone in their vehicle, so social distancing is easier, and they also use personal protective equipment if needed.
