Accident on Hwy. 281N.

From Texas DPS: On Saturday October 15th, at approximately 11:54am, 8.3 miles N. of Lampasas, Texas DPS Troopers responded to a report of an injury crash between three vehicles. A 2019 Black Ford Fiesta passenger car, operated by a 23-year-old female from Lampasas, Texas, was traveling northbound on US 281 in the inside lane. A 2017 Black Toyota Yaris Passenger car, operated by a 39-year-old female from Lampasas, Texas, was stopped at the intersection of US 281 and CR 2227 in the inside lane of US 281 facing northbound preparing to turn left onto CR 2227.

The investigating Trooper reported that driver inattention and failing to control speed caused the driver of the Ford to collide with the rear end of the Toyota. The collision caused the Toyota to cross into the southbound lane and into the path of a 2003 Gold Lexus RX3 passenger car, operated by a 72-year-old male from, Marble Falls, Texas.

The driver of the Ford refused medical treatment on scene. The driver of the Toyota was transported to Advent health ER in Killeen. The driver of Lexus was transported via CareFlite to Seton Williamson County with incapacitating injuries. A 69-year-old female passenger in the Lexus was transported to Seton Williamson County via Hamilton EMS. The crash investigation is still open. 'One Pill Kills' Campaign

Governor Greg Abbott today announced the launch of the State of Texas' coordinated "One Pill Kills" campaign to combat the growing national fentanyl crisis plaguing Texas and the United

States. This announcement comes after Governor Abbott directed state agencies to ramp up efforts to combat the deadly fentanyl crisis last month.

Following a roundtable discussion with state and local law enforcement, the Governor was joined by Texas Department of Public Safety Director Steve McCraw and Beaumont Police Chief James Singletary for a press conference highlighting the severity of the fentanyl crisis and outlined the comprehensive actions taken by the State of Texas to address the unprecedented influx of this deadly drug into communities across the state.

"Fentanyl remains the single deadliest drug threat our state and nation has ever encountered, killing four Texans every day," said Governor Abbott. "Fentanyl is a clandestine killer, with Mexican drug cartels strategically manufacturing and distributing the drug disguised as painkillers, stimulants, anti-anxiety drugs, and even candy. In the Biden Administration's negligence to address this national security threat, Texas has designated Mexican drug cartels as terrorist organizations and is launching a statewide public awareness campaign to fight the fentanyl crisis in our state. I am proud to announce the launch of the State of Texas' comprehensive 'One Pill Kills' campaign to remind Texans that just one pill laced with fentanyl can take someone's life. Together, we will protect more innocent lives from being lost to this deadly drug."

Governor Abbott also announced new laws to be considered this upcoming legislative session that would classify fentanyl as a poisoning, allow charging an individual for murder if they distribute fentanyl or drugs laced with fentanyl that kill someone, and make NARCAN more readily available across the state for Texans exposed to fentanyl.

Last year, almost 1,700 Texans lost their lives because of fentanyl. Fentanyl is the number one cause of death in Americans between the ages of 18 and 45. From February 2021 to February 2022, more than 75,000 Americans died as a result of fentanyl-related overdoses. In the past year, Texas law enforcement alone has seized over 342 million lethal doses of fentanyl—enough to kill every man, woman, and child in the United States.

Ransomware Targeting School Districts

For the past two years, ransomware attacks have been on the rise in K-12, and districts are struggling to keep up.

Ransomware can be debilitating to districts and can impact the availability of services to educate students. Ransomware encrypts targeted systems, rendering files and applications useless. Having encrypted a district's data, cybercriminals demand a ransom to decrypt the files. In the past, that would have been the end of the attack. The school could choose to pay and retrieve the data or not. (cont'd on back)



(cont'd from front) Now, K-12 institutions have better backup and recovery mechanisms in place. It takes less time to recover from an attack than in years past — what might have taken months or years to achieve is now possible in weeks, days or even hours. As a result, institutions don't feel compelled to pay ransom because they can restore the encrypted data themselves.

Ransomware threat actors are evolving in response to this and have become more deliberate in their attacks. In the past, threat actors would "spray and pray" against all manner of organizations, hoping some would pay the ransom. Today, ransomware has evolved to create a double extortion for afflicted districts: After achieving domain admin within the environment and finding the "crown jewels," attackers will exfiltrate the data and then encrypt. Encryption is the final step in a prolonged compromise.
