The Weather



The High yesterday 86° The Low morning 71°

Note: The temperature in Lampasas went from 73° at 10:35am this morning to 63° at 10:55am.

The strongest cold front so far this season is moving at us this morning, with temperatures falling into the 50's by this afternoon. The forecasters look for the storms to die out by early this afternoon in our area. The south winds return tomorrow, but highs are forecast to only be in the 60's. Sunday will have warmer temperatures, high humidity and wind before the next front on Monday. A big temperature drop is expected on Monday, with Tuesday being unseasonably cold. With the front on Monday expect a few days of rain. Temperatures will slowly warm up later in the week, nevertheless, we're still looking at well below normal temps for late October.

Today: Mostly cloudy with a 30% chance of showers and storms early this afternoon. The temperature is expected to fall into the 50's by 5pm. Wind will be N and increasing to 15-20 mph this afternoon with 30 mph gusts possible.

Tonight: Cloudy and a low near 48°, winds will be brisk from the N into the night at 10-20 mph gusting to 25 mph.

Saturday: Mostly cloudy with gradual clearing and a high temperature near 68°. Winds will be light from the N-NW becoming calm.

Saturday night: Look for mostly clear skies with a low near 56° and light S-SE winds.

Sunday: Mostly sunny with a high near 84°. The wind will be from the south at 10-15 mph with possible gusts as high as 25 mph.

Sunday Night: Partly cloudy and 55°. Winds will be south at 5-10 mph becoming variable.

Monday: Cloudy with a high temperature near 57° and N winds at 5-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

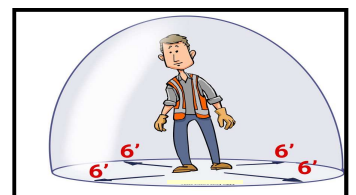

The Blotter

Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Thursday shows an early morning noise disturbance in the 600 block of S. Western St. at 12:20am. At 4:22am in the 300 block of N. A major accident took place in the 1200 block of E. 4th St. at 12:33 with injuries. The afternoon also showed a reported assault in the 1700 block of CTE at 2:07pm, a criminal trespass on Snell Dr. at 2:11pm, a reported theft in the 1000 block of Mill St., and a reported fraud in the 200 block of Hereford Dr. at 2:09pm. At 3:52pm suspicious activity was reported in the 400 block of Gamel St. and a report of criminal mischief came in from the 2700 block of 281S. Lampasas Sheriff's blotter for Thursday shows Lometa with a medical call and a fish & game call. In Kempner there was a fish & game call, reports of criminal mischief, civil matters, animal/livestock issues, and an accident. Out in the county deputies were busy with civil matters, a reported fraud, a house watch, a fish & game call, a welfare check, livestock issues and an alarm call. Deputies went into Cove for animal issues.

Please Note: We checked with Judge Hoyer's office and the county-wide burn ban is in effect at this time! Judge Hoyer will review this next week and may decide to lift it at that time.

Educators agree the best way to teach children is in person, however due to issues with the Covid-19, many students are remote, or virtual learning. The Dallas Morning News reported on September 3rd that the number of students in Texas that never engaged in their remote learning was 100,000, and 20,000 students were unable to be contacted. More than 2 million public school students are already attending in-person classes, doubled from the start of the school year. However, Texas has about 5.5 million students total.

According to the Texas Tribune, as the extent of students' struggles become clear, parents and superintendents are increasingly determined to get students back to school, the pendulum of their worries swinging away from health risks and toward the risks of students not learning at all. "Districts are starting to feel some real internal pressure as educators," said Joy Baskin, legal services director at the Texas Association of School Boards. "If they feel that there's enough momentum around getting everyone back, I think that's their preference."

Dr. Rascoe of Lampasas ISD shared this with Lampasas Radio "We are continuing it (remote learning) for now but have made several improvements. We have seen a significant increase in the number of students who returned to in person learning this grading period, thus there aren't as many students using remote learning. We have set greater expectations for remote learners as well and that has helped increase the validity of the program. Currently, we have several families who truly have the need to continue remote learning due to family members who have life threatening susceptibility to the virus. We are evaluating the program often and could decide to change it in the future
